CORPUS CHRISTI, THE FEAST OF THE BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST BY KRISTI SCHERBAUM, DCM

"I am the living bread that came down from heaven; if any one eats of this bread, he will live forever;...he who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life and... abides in me, and I in him"

John 6:51, 54, 56

It is not man that causes the things offered to become the Body and Blood of Christ, but he who was crucified for us, Christ himself. The priest, in the role of Christ, pronounces these words, but their power and grace are God's. This is my body, he says. This word transforms the things offered.

St. John Chrysostom

Imagine that you are waiting in a line, waiting to see Jesus. In a few minutes, He will be directly in front of you. How would you approach him? With indifference, casually, with reverence?

As Catholics, we believe in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharistic species. This sets us apart from all other faiths. Through the words and actions of the priest and the power of the Holy Spirit, ordinary bread and wine are transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ.

We should approach the Eucharistic table as we would approach Jesus, in person, with reverence, dignity, and awe. We are about to receive Christ into our bodies and souls. We should be aware that our posture and gestures can reflect how important we believe the action of receiving Communion is.

As we celebrate the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ today, let us reflect and remind ourselves of how to properly prepare to receive Jesus in the Eucharist, and for those who have yet to receive this sacrament or are not prepared, how to receive a blessing.

To receive a blessing: Process in line to the altar with your arms crossed over your chest. Your hands should be resting on the front of your shoulders. This lets the priest or Eucharistic Minister know that you are requesting a blessing from him or her, and not Holy Communion. When the person in front of you is receiving, respectfully bow, and then step up to the priest or Eucharistic Minister to receive your blessing. Prayerfully return to your seat in a quiet manner.

<u>To receive Holy Communion:</u> Process in line to the altar with your hands folded prayerfully. As the person in front of you is receiving, respectfully bow, and then step up to the priest or Eucharistic Minister, with your hands ready to receive the Host.







Children who are receiving the Eucharist, please hold your hands raised to just below shoulder level, not held at waist level.

The priest or minister will say, "The Body of Christ." Your response of "Amen." is the only correct response. You are stating that you believe in the Real Presence of Christ.


Once you have received Holy Communion, step to the side and consume the host. Many people make the Sign of the Cross at this time, but it is not a requirement. If you are not receiving the Precious Blood, return to your seat quietly.

To receive the Precious Blood of Christ: Approach the minister in the same manner as above. After bowing, the minister will say, "The Blood of Christ" and again the only correct response is "Amen." Receive the cup from the minister, with both hands, and consume a small amount. Return the cup to the minister and again, many people make the Sign of the Cross, but it is not a requirement. Return to your seat in a quiet manner.

In the pew, one should pray and continue to kneel, if possible, and sit back when the priest has placed the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle and returned to his seat.


