Dear Parents and Guardians

Biology and Geography fieldtrip to the Axe Estuary Wetlands Centre

We are writing to inform you that Year 9 students have the opportunity to visit the River Axe to enhance their work in Biology and Geography. Both departments believe that there is great value in students actually experiencing their environment, rather than simply discussing issues such as sustainability and biodiversity in the classroom. Completing their own investigations in this unique setting will help learning to be more memorable for students and, hopefully, stimulate a wider awareness of issues for the future.

Situated between Seaton and Colyford, the Axe Estuary Wetlands are a rich mosaic of marshes and meadows, providing a haven for wildlife. East Devon District Council has created a 'Living Classroom' beside the estuary, providing the base for our investigations into river landscapes and habitats. Students will be working in and around the streams feeding the River Axe on its western banks.

- Lunch: Packed lunch and drink must be brought. Students entitled to Free School Meals should order their lunch from the Dining Hall. There are no shops nearby.
