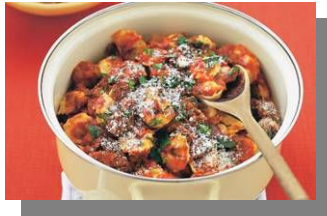

CLUB KITCHEN

It's winter, and we have another stew style dish for you. You could make this one on a trip, or reheat it in a camp oven.

Slow-cooked beef with tortellini



Ingredients (serves 6)

- 1 tbs olive oil
- 900g beef chuck (casserole) steak, cut into 2cm pieces
- 1 brown onion, halved, finely chopped
- 2 garlic cloves, crushed
- 1 x 800g can diced tomatoes
- 125ml (1/2 cup) water
- 2 tbs tomato paste
- 1 tsp caster sugar
- 2 tbs finely chopped fresh continental parsley
- 2 tbs finely chopped fresh basil
- Salt & freshly ground black pepper
- 1 x 625g pkt veal tortellini
- 20g (1/4 cup) finely grated parmesan

Method

Heat the oil in a large saucepan over medium heat. Add the beef and cook, stirring occasionally, for 5 minutes or until brown all over. Transfer to a heatproof bowl.

Add the onion and garlic to the pan and cook, stirring, for 3 minutes or until onion softens. Add the beef, tomato, water, tomato paste and sugar. Bring to the boil. Reduce heat to low and simmer, covered, stirring occasionally, for 1 1/2 hours or until beef is tender. Cook, uncovered, for 15-20 minutes or until sauce thickens slightly. Remove from heat. Add the parsley and basil, and stir to combine. Taste and season with salt and pepper.

Meanwhile, cook the tortellini in a large saucepan of salted boiling water following packet directions. Drain well.

Add the tortellini to the beef mixture and stir to combine. Sprinkle with parmesan and serve immediately.

The convoy made its way to Brunton's bridge, with a crossing of the Thompson River to reach the idle island for lunch.

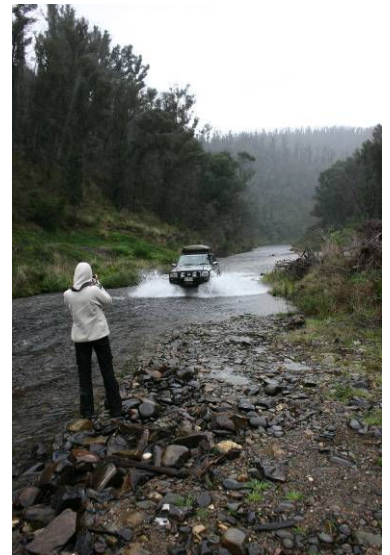
