

We at the Church of the Advent strive to be an open and affirming community of Christians welcoming anyone seeking companionship, spiritual nourishment, opportunity for worship and, as Christ directs us, to engage with and provide for the poor and vulnerable in local and global communities.

We welcome today the Rt. Rev. James Cowan, 12th Bishop of British Columbia as our Presider and preacher today.

Born in Saskatchewan, James Cowan attended the College of Emmanuel and St. Chad in Saskatoon and the University of Saskatchewan where he obtained a BA in 1974. He later attended Nashotah House Seminary in Wisconsin where he obtained a Master of Divinity degree in 1977.

Early ministry appointments were in the Diocese of Qu'Appelle prior to his arrival in our diocese as executive archdeacon. From this position he was elected Bishop in 2003.



Nationally Bishop Cowan is a member of the Council of General Synod and acts as the Canadian episcopal representative to the Executive Council of the Episcopal Church, and is a member of the National Finance Management Committee. He is also a member of the National House of Bishops Standing Committee on Religious Orders.

Internationally he maintains close connections with the church in Myanmar which he has now visited several times. He is married to Annette Hubbard and they have two sons, Sean and Brent. In his spare time interests include gardening, reading, bee keeping, camping and hiking.


