George Washington Carver was born into slavery on a Southwest Missouri farm, and would triumph as an Educator, Scientist, Artist, Man of Faith, and Humanitarian. The invaluable lessons of his life and legacy are remembered and reaffirmed today at George Washington Carver National Monument. The Monument is the birthplace and childhood home of Dr. Carver and is an inspiration to all who visit. Annually, over 40,000 individuals visit the 240-acre park. All activities and services at the park are provided free of charge and include ranger-led programs, a hiking trail, 1881 Carver House tours, museum exhibits, school programs, park films, an 18,000 square foot Visitor Center, and much more.

The George Washington Carver Birthplace Association (CBA) has served as the Monument's non-profit cooperating association since the Monument's inception, working to help support the National Park Service's educational and interpretative programs. From bookstore sales, memberships, donations and awarded grants, CBA has assisted in a variety of ways, from securing speakers/artists for various park events, to making the wagon rides at Prairie Day possible, to accepting and donating to the National Park Service the final 30 acres of the original Moses Carver Farm. In 2008, programs such as the Carver Series (Carver Day; Carver Evenings and Carver Afternoons) and Young People's Initiatives (school outreach; Carver Scholarship) were joined by the inaugural Symposium on George Washington Carver and His Life and Times. Modeled after The Lincoln Forum, the purpose of The Carver Symposium is to encourage inquiry and promote discussion about Carver, his social and physical environments, and to explore how a better understanding of his life and times can illuminate modern issues.

CBA is a membership-based organization with supporters who have a variety of interests and backgrounds, which is only fitting considering Dr. Carver's contributions to agriculture, the environment, education, the arts, and industry.
