What is TRiO?

TRiO Student Support Services is an academic support program funded by a federal grant under the authority of the U.S. Department of Education. TRiO has provided CAC students a broad range of academic support services since September 1, 2005.

Why is the program called TRiO?

Student Support Services is one of three (TRiO) original academic support service programs created under the Higher Education Act of 1965. While the first two programs (Talent Search & Upward Bound) work to encourage youth and teens to prepare and enroll in college after high school graduation, Student Support Services provides support to students to enhance their academic success once they are enrolled in college.

What services does TRiO provide?

TRiO is a comprehensive academic support program that provides enrolled participants with a wide variety of services that will enhance and support their abilities to achieve their academic goals. Services include:

- Academic Assessment (not an academic skills test) You will complete a computerized assessment that is designed to help you learn more about your academic strengths and weaknesses.
- Academic Advising You will be assigned an advisor or faculty mentor based on your academic and personal goals.
- One-on-one Tutoring TRiO tutors are well versed in their respective subjects and are
 prepared to meet various learning styles. Throughout the semester, as a TRiO student
 you will be able to sign-up for weekly tutoring beyond the one-hour time limits offered at
 the Learning Center.
- Financial Literacy One of the most cited reasons for students leaving college without earning a degree is financial difficulty. TRiO uses an interactive online tool called CashCourse that allows students to learn about topics related to their own personal financial needs such as budgeting, debt management, credit cards, student loan repayment requirements, identity theft, and credit scores.
- Financial Aid TRiO is able to assist you in your search for financial assistance. We offer assistance in filing your FAFSA and in your search for scholarships.
- Grant-Aid Scholarship A portion of funds appropriated to TRiO by the federal government is reserved for scholarship money that we award to students that meet specific guidelines including academic achievement and financial need.
- Career Exploration Your faculty mentor or advisor will work with you to ensure that you have made an informed career decision. There are several useful tools that will help

- you learn more about your own personal interests and work style as well as jobs that match your abilities.
- Personal Advising TRiO does not provide professional counseling services, but we are able to offer general advice on coping with some of life's basic issues that may impact your academic success. If the assistance that you require is beyond our scope, we will gladly help you find assistance through our resource guide of local community agencies.

Who is eligible to apply for TRiO?

If you are a U.S. citizen or FAFSA eligible non-citizen, enrolled at CAC (full-time), plan to graduate and transfer with an Associate's degree or Certificate from CAC, AND meet *one* of the following criteria, you will be eligible to apply for enrollment in the TRiO program.

- First generation neither of your parents or guardians earned a Bachelor's degree.
- Low income your household income meets federal guidelines (TRiO can help you determine eligibility).
- Documented disability on file with CAC Disability Resource Services.

If you meet the criteria listed above and are willing to meet the program expectations, we will gladly review your application for enrollment.

If I meet the criteria listed above, am I guaranteed enrollment into the TRiO program? No. The criteria listed above stipulate who is eligible to apply; there are however, additional federal requirements that must be considered before we are able to invite you to enroll in the TRiO program. These requirements include:

- 1. Student must be able to graduate with an Associate's degree or Certificate and transfer within four years after enrolling in the TRiO program; and
- 2. Upon completion of the intake interview with TRiO staff, it must be determined that the applicant demonstrates an academic need and the potential to benefit from services, and is willing to work with the expectations of TRiO; and
- 3. Students must be in good academic standing with CAC as defined in the College Catalog; and
- 4. The student must be a full-time student.

What is the application process?

- 1. Inform yourself You have already taken the first step by reading through these FAQ's.
- 2. Apply Complete and return the application to the TRiO office at the Signal Peak Campus in the M building (Rm.113) in the Advising Area.
- 3. Evaluate After receiving your application, the TRiO Director will evaluate your application to determine if you are a candidate for the program. This evaluation will include: (a) a verification to determine if you meet the eligibility requirement of: first generation, low income, and/or student with a disability; (b) a completed academic plan (MAP) to determine if you will be able to complete degree requirements within a 4-year timeframe; and, (c) a determination of your level of academic need and potential to benefit from TRiO program services based upon your self-assessment (included in the application), an interview, Compass scores, academic assessments and academic history.

Applicants that do not meet program eligibility requirements will receive a letter informing them why they have been deemed ineligible for the program. All applicants denied enrollment may schedule an appointment with the TRiO Director to discuss the enrollment decision in greater detail.

4. Acceptance – The TRiO Director will contact you by phone and you will receive a letter in the mail confirming your acceptance to the program.

What if I only want to use a few services offered through TRiO, such as the Grant-Aid Scholarship?

If you choose to apply to TRiO for the Grant-Aid Scholarship only, TRiO is probably not a good fit for you. We are seeking students who truly want to make use of the services to help enhance their academic performance and help them reach their full academic potential. As a comprehensive program, TRiO offers a wide variety of services designed to work in unison. We don't expect you to use all the services within the first semester, but we do anticipate that if you are to truly benefit from the program we offer, you will embrace the opportunity to become an ACTIVE TRiO participant.

Am I required to use all of the services offered through the TRiO program?

We do not require that you use every service offered, but we do strongly encourage that you take full advantage of all services that will enhance your academic and personal development. There are a few services that TRiO participants are *required* to complete (base on TRiO regulations and/or federal legislation). The REQUIRED services include:

- Academic Assessment
- Academic Advising you are required to meet with your TRiO faculty mentor or advisor
- Financial Literacy (computer assessment and complete FAFSA)

In addition to the required services listed above, there are also expectations of our TRiO participants. These expectations include:

- You will meet with your TRiO faculty mentor or advisor at least four times throughout the semester.
- You will meet with your TRiO faculty mentor or advisor when you encounter any difficulties in your course(s) to discuss appropriate strategies for success.
- You will give substantial consideration to the advice offered by your TRiO faculty mentor or advisor. In addition to their degrees, they have extensive practical college experience and training, and the advice they have to offer is based on their personal and professional experiences as well as the experience of their current and former advisees.
- You will take advantage of tutoring (TRiO tutoring or LC tutoring) for those courses that you anticipate as being "trouble courses" and/or those unexpected difficult courses.
- You will be on time and present for all scheduled TRiO tutor, faculty mentor, and advisor meetings.
- You will complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)
- If eligible, you will apply for the TRiO Grant-Aid Scholarship.
