A MESSAGE FROM OUR BOARD CHAIR

It has been an exciting year for the Cobequid Community Health Centre Foundation with new staff, another successful Walk Run event and the planning for our upcoming Valentine Gala.

Our Annual Appeal is underway, and we are raising funds for the purchase of a Carotid Ultrasound Unit, used in the detection of full strokes. In our Annual Appeal materials, we introduced Michael, a 34 year old father who awoke one morning with limited vision in one eye. He assumed it was fatigue, but by the time he finished breakfast, his leg was numb.

A trip to the Cobequid Community Health Centre emergency department determined Michael was having a mini-stroke. Stories like this are scary and common. With this new piece of equipment, the Carotid Ultrasound Unit will help our health professionals in the early detection of strokes to prevent serious long term damage to patients like Michael.

We hope you are able to support our Annual Appeal this year, and perhaps we will see you dancing the night away at our 2nd Annual Valentine Gala - February 9, 2008. On behalf of the Foundation Board of Directors and Staff, we wish you all the best in 2008. DONORS MAKING A DIFFERENCE



Mickey MacDonald is known for his many successful business ventures. However, what you may not know is that Mr. MacDonald is also a generous supporter of the Cobequid Community Health Centre.

During our Getting Better Together, Capital Campaign, Mr. MacDonald pledged \$150,000 to help enhance health services for the community, on behalf of his business, Palooka's Gym. "I have made this investment in honour of the hard working and dedicated staff that work in my businesses. After all, it is only through them that I am able to be in a position to give back." said Mr. MacDonald.

The new building brought many upgrades to the Health Centre including a cutting edge physiotherapy department named after Palooka's Gym, in honor of Mr. MacDonald's commitment to the Health Centre. An important component of rehabilitative physiotherapy is exercise equipment, something Mr. MacDonald became very familiar with after opening Palooka's Gym.

This new equipment allows the centre to make another addition - a new Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD) Rehabilitation Program. This program is made possible through a partnership between Respiratory Services and Physiotherapy, in part due to the generous donation made by Mr. MacDonald and Palooka's Gym.

Donna Haverstock, Nurse Educator with the Asthma/COPD Program, can quickly identify the importance of the Program at CCHC. "I am pleased we can offer this program. It allows us to encourage individuals with similar symptoms of COPD to exercise and improve their quality of life. The necessary equipment makes this possible."

COPD largely affects those over the age of 50, and can reduce a person's mobility due to a shortness of breath and decreased energy. The COPD Rehabilitation Program will be comprised of an education component and an exercise component. Getting people moving

not only improves their health, but also their confidence in their ability to improve their lifestyles. People interested in participating in the COPD Rehabilitation Program should speak with their family doctor to arrange a referral.

DEDICATED STAFF MEMBER AND VOLUNTEER, ALL IN ONE!

In 1980 Beth Harland, joined a friend of hers to volunteer with the new medical centre in Sackville. She could not have known that it would develop into her career.

Beth joined founders Shirley Freer and Carol Crosby as a volunteer receptionist, and traveled with them as they moved around to a few locations before settling into the Cobequid Multi-Service Centre on Memory Lane. When thinking about her time with Freer and Crosby, a noticeable smile comes across her face. "A lot of people come to work only for the pay, and with no soul, and don't get me wrong, I like the pay, but Shirley had soul. She was fabulous and wanted everything for the public."

In September of 1981, Beth was sponsored by the Cobequid Multi-Services Centre and the government department, Manpower, and was retrained as a formal receptionist. After her training, she joined the paid staff as a receptionist, and remained in that role for five years.



When the freestanding Emergency Department was built in 1987, Beth relocated and took on a new role with the Centre. On the day the ER opened, Beth was there as a Ward Clerk, where she was the only staff member in that role for 20 years. She was then on hand for the last day of operations at the Cobequid Multi-Service Centre, and also for the first day at the new Cobequid Community Health Centre.

When asked about her favourite part of her job, she struggled to pin it down to one thing. "Well, I guess it has to be the satisfaction that comes from day-to-day work with the staff. You feel like you're really making a difference here."

Over the years, Beth has adopted many volunteer roles within the Centre for both the Foundation and Christmas Cheer, a staff-led program that provides gifts for families in need during the holidays. She had volunteered with the long standing Cobequid Christmas Concert, and continued to help the committee when the event evolved into the Valentine Gala. This year Beth is chairing the silent auction component of the Gala.

ANNUAL APPEAL

Since moving to the new location at 40 Freer Lane, the Cobeguid Community Health Centre Foundation has purchased a number of new pieces of equipment, and helped to fund new programs and services to better health care for our area residents.

This year the funds raised from our Annual Appeal will go toward the purchase of a

Carotid Ultrasound Unit, used to detect full strokes and help prevent the long term effects and heartache full strokes cause.

Consider Michael's story. Michael engages in a healthy lifestyle, playing baseball and eating well. When he awoke one morning with limited vision in one eye, he assumed it was fatigue. By breakfast, his leg was numb. This young husband and father was experiencing a mini stroke.

The Carotid Ultrasound Unit at the cost of \$250,000, will help our health professional work to decrease the number of stroke related fatalities in Nova Scotia. As it is, strokes are the fourth-leading cause of death in Canada.
