

The Sponsorship of International Medical Graduates for Registration

Introduction

1. The purpose of this document is to help organisations and individuals to describe their arrangements for sponsoring international medical graduates (IMGs) for full registration.

2. Please read the guidance notes carefully then complete the template to describe your organisation's arrangements for sponsoring overseas trainees.

Submitting an application to become a sponsor

4. The completed template should be returned to the following address:

5. You must return the form with any documents that you refer to in your proposed assessment detailed in the template, typically this includes the following but this is not an exhaustive list:

- a. Application form
- b. Reference forms
- c. Interview questions
- d. Your organisation's equality impact assessment scheme

6. If you want to submit the form electronically, you can by pressing the 'Submit form' button. If you have an email client such as Microsoft Outlook installed, the form will send automatically. If not, you will be given the option to save the form and send via webmail. Please make sure to email all supporting documentation to sponsorship@gmc-uk.org if you submit the form electronically.

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Guidance Notes for Sponsors

What's the purpose of sponsorship?

7. Section 21B of the Medical Act 1983 (as amended) sets out the framework for granting registration to IMGs. Among other things, IMGs must satisfy the GMC that they possess the knowledge, skills and experience necessary to practise as a fully registered medical practitioner in the UK.

8. Applicants for full registration may satisfy the Registrar that they've the necessary knowledge, skills and experience in one of the following four ways:

- a. Passing the Professional and Linguistic Assessments Board (PLAB) test (69% of IMG doctors enter the register via this route)
- b. Sponsorship by an approved sponsor (10 % of IMG doctors enter the register via this route)
- c. Award of approved postgraduate qualifications (PGQ) (20% of IMG doctors enter the register via this route)
- d. Eligibility for entry onto the GP or Specialist Register. (1% of IMG doctors enter the register via this route¹)

9. The PLAB test is a broad based examination designed to ensure that IMGs are competent to practise in the UK at the level of a UK Graduate who has completed the requirements for full registration in any of the main branches of medicine and surgery.

10. Sponsored doctors will be those who are already some way advanced in their chosen specialty and who wish to pursue further specialist training in the UK and for whom taking the PLAB test may not be appropriate.

11. Before granting registration to a sponsored doctor, the GMC must be satisfied that the doctor has been selected under quality assured arrangements which have been designed to safeguard the interests and safety of patients. These arrangements must be objective, robust and evidence based.

12. The GMC has a process for approving the schemes offered to assess doctors' knowledge, skills and experience which is detailed below. As well as ensuring the quality of the assessment before giving its approval, the GMC expects to be able to audit the schemes regularly to ensure that quality is maintained. You will be asked to submit evidence that you have completed all of the activities that are documented in your scheme prior to issuing a certificate of sponsorship. Please be aware that failure to respond to requests for information or adhere to deadlines may lead us to remove you from our list of approved sponsors.

Who are the sponsors?

13. Sponsors are organisations or individuals in the UK who have put in place suitable mechanisms, which the GMC has approved, for the selection of IMGs. The main sponsors of IMGs are the UK medical Royal Colleges and Faculties. A small number of postgraduate institutions in the UK are approved as sponsors. University heads of department may also sponsor doctors engaged primarily in research or studies for higher degrees where registration is required to allow the doctor to carry out clinical duties.

GMC approval of sponsorship schemes

14. If you wish to sponsor IMGs for registration we'll need to be satisfied that you've undertaken a rigorous assessment of each doctor's current capability for practice in the UK. You'll be asked to complete a sponsorship scheme proposal (SSP) describing your arrangements for selecting doctors for sponsorship in the UK. To be approved as a sponsor you'll need to satisfy the criteria set out in the SSP. When you've completed it, please email it to us for approval. We'll ask you to return the original copy, signed, if and when your scheme is approved.

15. If your sponsorship scheme is approved, any doctor sponsored under those arrangements will be regarded as having satisfied the legal requirement for knowledge, skills and experience. Doctors who have failed (and not subsequently passed) either part 1 or part 2 of the PLAB test or who have previously been turned down for sponsorship by an approved sponsor are not generally considered as suitable candidates for sponsorship. However, if the sponsor feels that an individual has demonstrated the knowledge, skills and experience required to practise under full registration, despite failing part of the PLAB test or not satisfying another sponsorship scheme, the Registrar may still consider the application. In such a circumstance we would strongly recommend the sponsor contact us before agreeing to sponsor a doctor.

What we require from sponsors

16. You should have a mechanism for selecting trainees that will enable you to assess their current suitability for medical practice in the UK. The mechanism should provide you with an objective means of determining whether candidates have the knowledge, skills and experience needed to practise safely under full registration.

17. It's our statutory duty to assess a doctor's capability for practice at the point of registration, and the evidence that the doctor supplies indicating their capability to practise must therefore be sufficiently up to date. As a minimum, a doctor applying for registration with an offer of sponsorship must have been engaged in medical practice for three out of the last five years including the most recent 12 months. The 12 month rule starts at the point the application for registration is made - please make sure that they don't come out of practice before this point. It's important to note that clinical attachments and observerships are not counted as medical practice and shouldn't be taken as such. Volunteer work may be acceptable provided that it can be supported by documented evidence. We allow a maximum gap of five weeks in a 12 month period for annual leave.

18. We wouldn't consider a doctor who does not meet these minimum criteria as being able to supply sufficiently up to date evidence of their medical practice to support their application.

IMG11 Page 3 of 14 19. In addition, we need to be satisfied that candidates meet the standards which are required of all doctors registered with the GMC. These are the standards set out in *Good Medical Practice* which can be found on our website at http://www.gmc-uk.org/quidance/good_medical_practice/index_asp. You must therefore have a means of

<u>uk.org/guidance/good_medical_practice/index.asp</u>. You must therefore have a means of assessing whether prospective sponsored doctors are committed to the principles contained in Good Medical Practice. The principles are set out in four domains:

- 1. Knowledge, skills and performance
- 2. Safety and quality
- 3. Communication, partnership and teamwork
- 4. Maintaining trust

20. Sponsored doctors will already have relevant specialist experience before coming to the UK and we expect them to be capable of working at least at the level of a UK graduate with a minimum of three years post-qualification experience when they first obtain registration. We recognise, however, that in some cases (perhaps because of a lack of technical facilities available to the doctor overseas) a short period of acclimatisation will be necessary for a doctor to become familiar with UK practice which is why all doctors who are registered for the first time are required to work in approved practice setting until their first revalidation. The primary consideration when assessing a candidate's suitability for sponsorship must always be patient safety.

21. It may be beneficial for applicants to go through a full induction programme prior to commencing the one month clinical attachment suggested in criterion two of the template to ensure they understand how they are expected to work within the UK and the NHS. From experiences shared with us by existing sponsors, it may also be beneficial for you to have a mechanism in place for removing an applicant from the application process if their performance was deemed insufficient during the initial or any subsequent trial period and whether you'd consider an appeal from them in this instance.

22. In approving sponsorship schemes the GMC doesn't dictate the terms and conditions for the administration of those schemes. It's for the sponsors themselves to decide if they wish, for example, to set a limit on the number of applicants or charge an administration fee.

23. Please note that we reserve the right to suspend or withdraw the scheme at any time. Sponsors should ensure that they adhere to the scheme criteria at all times.

Equality and Diversity

24. The GMC is committed to valuing diversity and promoting equality, and to ensuring that our processes are fair, objective, transparent and free from unlawful discrimination. The GMC Equality Scheme and Equality and Diversity Strategy 2010-2013 are available on our website at www.gmc-uk.org/about/equality_scheme/index.asp.

25. In addition to completing the sponsorship scheme template below we'll also require you to send us an equality and diversity report to demonstrate how you consider equality and diversity in your own procedures and policies – in particular how you will consider equality and diversity in how your sponsorship scheme is implemented. This could include an equality impact assessment (EIA) or analysis of your sponsorship scheme.

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26. This report will be considered by the Assistant Director of Registration alongside your template as supplementary information in support of the arrangements your organisation has in place to select IMGs for sponsorship.

Approved practice settings

27. Please note that any doctor whom you sponsor is required to work in an approved practice setting until their first revalidation; this is an environment which has systems for the effective management of doctors including systems for identifying and acting upon concerns about doctors' fitness to practise, systems to support the provision of relevant training or continuing professional development, and systems for providing regulatory assurance. A single standard for all doctors

28. All registered doctors must comply with the standards of competence, care and conduct described in *Good Medical Practice*. These are the standards which patients have a right to expect of their doctors, and it is against these standards that doctors will be judged. They apply equally to all UK, EEA and IMG doctors practising in the UK.

29. Those involved in sponsorship (e.g. sponsors, postgraduate deans and supervising consultants) should be familiar with the principles of *Good Medical Practice* and have regard to them in the way they select doctors.

30. All doctors applying for registration under sponsorship will also need to meet the other criteria for full registration. They will need to supply evidence of an acceptable primary medical qualification and of their knowledge of English and show that their fitness to practise is not impaired. Performance issues and revalidation

31. Full registration is registration which in theory allows a doctor to work unsupervised. If the doctor pays their annual retention fee, maintains an effective registered address and remains fit to practise their registration continues. Revalidation requires doctors to show that they remain up to date and are fit to practise. All licensed doctors, regardless of where and how they work need to revalidate on a regular basis if they wish to keep their licence to practise. This will normally be every five years, although depending on the circumstances this may be different. There are a number of systems in place, however, such as local appraisal arrangements, to identify doctors who are under performing. In addition, those doctors whose fitness to practise is in doubt and who present a danger to patient safety are dealt with through the GMC's fitness to practise procedures. 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Sponsorship certificates

32. Your assessment of a doctor's suitability for sponsorship should only be relevant to a **current** application for registration. Sponsorship certificates are only valid for three months from the date of issue. We don't accept certificates that are over three months old.
