From the Desk of the Pastor:

My Dear Friends in Christ

Today we celebrate the Second Sunday of Advent – a time of yearning – a time of preparation, a time of anticipation, for the coming of the Christ Child! We prepare by offering extra prayer, possibly a little fasting, alms giving, many random acts of kindness, and celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation at least once before Christmas. You and I work to prepare our "tabernacle" to receive the "Christ Child" into our hearts and bodies at Christmas. Today, we pause in joy that our journey of Advent is now in progress, and we are nearing that special moment – when the Christ Child will grace our stage.

Gospel Theme for Today: John the Baptist proclaims the "way of the Lord", the path to a new Heaven, a new Earth, a new Jerusalem. We ask God to show us his ways and teach us his paths, to help us turn to him.

In the First Reading, When Christ comes, all obstacles will be removed. Everything that stands in the way will be gone. A "Royal Road" must be prepared. To make way for the coming of the King! In the Second Reading, God wants us to pray to him without ceasing; his ways are clear only to those who acknowledge him for what he is. This is why we turn to him in prayer, again and again and again. As Scripture says," We pray without ceasing..."

The word "Advent" means "coming." Christ's first coming 'opened for us the way to eternal salvation.' In the beginning of Advent, we are not called to look directly at Christmas, but past it, to Christ's return. Advent is a gift that allows us to look at our sometimes frightening world, yet still be filled with confidence and hope. We look past Christmas right now so that when we do focus on Christmas, it will mean so much, much more. The trees and wrappings are not bad things, in fact, they can be good things, but they must be used to help us build anticipation while living in patience, waiting for our God who will not only come once, but will come again. If we race through Advent too fast, it may seem somewhat artificial – we need to slow down and "smell the poinsettias." "For, Jesus Is Truly The Reason For The Season!"

Advent is a time when we recollect ourselves. We welcome the "good news" that we are able to start over. We cherish the word of forgiveness. In fact we all know that when we sin, we have a debt to pay. Advent brings the good news of a messenger from God, someone who climbs up to the top of the mountain and tells that good news to the whole world. "I have come to forgive the sins of the entire world..." How grateful we are!!

Each Advent gives us another chance to start over to make ourselves ready and worthy for when He does come again...." Reconciliation is like tearing out those pages of our life that we don't like.... Do it!!!

"Love has nothing to do with what you are expecting to get; it's what you are expected to give – which is everything! All we need do is follow His Son's example – He gave everything...."
