Ask Fr. Meyer

My Dear People,

There have been rumors and the rumors are true. We are going to spend some time and money refurbishing, redecorating and taking care of the interior of our historic Church Buildings in the near future! After a year of the Archbishop's announcement that the four campuses would stay open, I would like to officially announce that we will be doing what the Archbishop asked of us.

Part of the charge that was given to us, by the Archbishop, was to have a parish that would not only celebrate the sacraments, proclaim the gospel, pass on the faith, serve the needy and be a place of fellowship...but also, maintain the buildings and not have their maintenance be a burden on the priest or the parish community.

As of now, we have been doing some exterior work to get ready for some interior work on the places where we gather for Holy Mass and the other sacraments. At the St. Paul Campus we have been working on a few moisture issues; at the St. Martin Campus we are getting ready for some tuck pointing that is needed; and at the St. Joseph Campus we have been working on the tower and some exterior painting. The plan is to move to the interiors in January of 2016.

It will be a long process, but there is a plan. We will start at St. John and then move to St. Paul followed by St. Martin and St. Joseph. We are starting at the St. John Campus for two reasons. First, there were not interior/exterior issues that needed to be addressed. Secondly, they had accumulated a large sum of restricted funds for interior restoration. The plan is to have them all completed within a two year time period or shorter. The scheduling is also being determined by scheduled weddings, parish events etc...the work will take about 6-8 weeks per campus.

So where will the funds come for these projects: we will be (1) using "old savings" from the four historic campuses, applying the monies to each particular campus project, (2) we will ask for donations from you, our parish family- more info to come, (3) we will use money from All Saints Parish Savings.

Who will do the work? We will take bids. In fact we have started the process, evaluate and make decisions. Who is the "we"? That would be the Parish Council, Finance Council and myself.

What will the project entail? We will focus mainly on plaster, paint and flooring. The main goal is to clean up, beautify and restore; there will be no major changes. The only major adjustment will be at the St. John Campus. Dover's historic high altar was removed years ago. Recently we have been gifted an historic altar from a closed church that matches the two side altars in Dover. This main altar will be installed and will also house the statues of St. John the Baptist and Jesus.

Why are we doing this? St. John Vianney would say over and over about his parish church building, "The parish church can never be beautiful enough. It is God's house!" If we look at our four church building's paint and carpet, the majority of us can agree that our homes look better- there is something wrong with that. God lives here! We are called to love God above and beyond all things and love our neighbor as our self. Part of loving God is to giving Him fitting honor, glory, adoration and giving Him our best! This is my prayer- not to fix buildings, just to look pretty, but to glorify God. To raise our minds and hearts to Him...so we can love Him more and love our neighbor even better.



Homily Review

13th Sunday in Ordinary Time— B Jesus wants us to have faith in him, to believe in him, and tell others about our faith and heal them. He desires greatly that we tell others through our actions. He desires we become like him, Christ, the Healer, and go out and touch someone, embrace them. Touch someone spiritually or physically. Touch human misery, touch the human flesh of others, touch those who are bruised and suffering. Touch them with your hand or your heart. Arise today with faith and be healed! Go out and touch someone.

14th Sunday in Ordinary Time- B Whoever tells our history will also be the one who creates our present and our destiny. So, what is our history- and who is telling it! It seems someone has re-written the history of America without religion and God, and thus we have the America of today. Our foundation is Natural Law and divine truth. American exceptionalism has proven itself: we are exceptional- we are the best- Why? Because we are rooted in TRUTH with Christianity in our roots. Thomas Jefferson said, "the comparison of our government with those of Europe is like a comparison of heaven and hell." Andrew Jackson said, "the Bible is the rock on which this Republic rests." Have we forgotten our history? The first meeting of the Continental Congress on Sept. 6, 1774 involved 3 hours of prayer and a bible study focusing on Psalm 35. The Declaration of Independence was written by 56 men, many of whom were very strong and devout Christians: Witherspoon, Charles Thompson, Benjamin Rush, Roger Sherman and many others. The U.S. Congress in September 1782, not even a year after the closing battle of Yorktown, aided, blessed and approved the publishing of the first American Edition of the bible "we recommend this edition of the Bible to stating, the inhabitants of the United States." The peace most holy and undivided Trinity." John Adams, our 2nd president, stated, "the general principles on which the fathers achieved independence, were the general principals of Christianity"....also..."There is authority, civil or religious- there can be NO treaty of Sept. 3, 1786, begins... "in the name of the legitimate Government- but by what is administered by the Holy

Spirit." In George Washington's (our first president's) Farewell Address he states, "of all the habits and dispositions which lead to political prosperity...RELIGION and **MORALITY** are indispensable supports." Why has our nation been blessed....our biblical foundation and the faith of our founders. Forget our history...forget foundation...jeopardize our future! This re-writing of our history is extremely new-just 60 years ago in 1956- "In god we trust," was adopted as the official motto as an alternative or replacement to the unofficial motto of E pluribus unum. 1956, the nation was struggling through the Cold War, and the United States wanted to distinguish itself from the Soviet Union, which promoted state atheism. In 1954- Eisenhower also changed the wording of the Pledge of Allegiance by adding the phrase "under God," he wrote, "From this day forward, the millions of our school children will daily proclaim in every city and town, every village and rural school house, the dedication of our nation and our people to the Almighty.... In this way we are reaffirming the transcendence of religious faith in America's heritage and future; in this way we shall constantly strengthen those spiritual weapons which forever will be our country's most powerful resource, in peace or in war." It is just in the past few decades that our history as a biblical and Christian nation has been re-written. Let's re-discover our foundation and build upon it again!

15th Sunday in Ordinary Time- B God Chooses- God Qualifies-God Provides. God is calling all of us, not just some, but all of us- not to mediocracy but to holiness. God does not call the qualified, He qualifies the called. God provides when we TRUST in Him.
