SMC SUMMER INSTITUTE FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

Come and take free college classes at Santa Monica College through our Summer Institute for High School Students. These programs are FREE to high school students who have completed the 8th, 9th, 10th, or 11th grades. Students must complete the SMC English assessment if they are planning on enrolling in the following programs: business, psychology, biology, and chemistry. For these programs, students must place into Level B English or higher. For Chemistry 10, students must also take the math assessment and place into Math 20 — Intermediate Algebra or higher.

Programs are offered in the following areas:

- BUSINESS
- PSYCHOLOGY
- SCIENCE BIOLOGY
- SCIENCE CHEMISTRY

FREE CLASSES

The enrollment fee for these classes is waived to program participants (other student fees may apply), see page 6 for details. Keep in mind that these are college level classes and you are expected to study and do the required coursework. These classes become part of your permanent college records.

FREE TEXTBOOKS

All required textbooks are supplied to students.

FREE SUPPORT SERVICES

Students are encouraged to take advantage of the opportunities for peer support, counseling, study skills workshops and tutoring/study groups.

APPLICATIONS are accepted via US mail only. Applications must be postmarked after March 31, 2009 to be accepted. Deadline to accept applications is May 30, 2009, or until the class enrollment is filled. **Please do not bring applications to our office, they will not be accepted.**

Apply early, as the date the application is postmarked may be considered in eligibility.

BUSINESS PROGRAM

This program is for students interested in pursuing a career in Business.

BUS 1, INTRODUCTION TO BUSINESS

3 UNITS

Transfer: UC, CSU

Prerequisite: None.

Skills Advisory: Eligibility for English 1.

This course provides students with an overview of business in an increasingly global society. Students will complete the course with knowledge of the general business environment, economic systems, business ethics, operations and project management, and technology and information systems. In addition, students will learn the fundamentals of economics, business ownership, entrepreneurship, finance, management and marketing. Key themes woven throughout the course include exploration of career options and development of business problem-solving skills.

PSYCHOLOGY PROGRAM

This program is an introduction to students who may wish to pursue a career in either Early Childhood Education or Education.

PSYCH 11, CHILD GROWTH AND DEVELOPMENT

3 UNITS

Transfer: UC, CSU

IGETC AREA 4 (Social & Behavioral Sciences)

Prerequisite: None.

Skills Advisory: Eligibility for English 1.

This course will examine the major developmental milestones for children, both typically and atypically developing, from conception through adolescence in the areas of physical, psychosocial, and cognitive development. Emphasis will be on interactions between maturational and environmental factors within a culturally sensitive framework. While studying developmental theory and investigative research methodologies, students will observe children, evaluate individual differences and analyze characteristics of development at various stages.

BIOLOGY

BIOL 3, FUNDAMENTALS OF BIOLOGY

4 UNITS

Transfer: UC, CSU

IGETC AREA 5B (Biological Sciences, + LAB)

Prerequisite: None.

Skills Advisory: Eligibility for English 1.

This general biology course is for transfer students who are not biology majors. Topics include basic molecular and cellular biology, genetics, the anatomy and physiology of plants, animals and humans, the diversity of life, evolution, and ecology. Current environmental issues and new developments in biological science are discussed. Laboratory experiences are integrated and stress scientific methodology and thinking. *Credit is allowed for one course from either Biology 3, 4, Botany 1. No UC credit given for Biology 3 if taken after Biology 21, 22 or 23.

CHEMISTRY

CHEM 10, INTRODUCTORY GENERAL CHEMISTRY

5 UNITS

Transfer: UC. CSU

IGETC AREA 5A (Physical Sciences, + LAB)

Walker Waugh M V

Prerequisite: Math 31.

*U.C. gives no credit for Chemistry 10 if taken after Chemistry 11.

This is an introductory laboratory course. It introduces principles, laws, and nomenclature of inorganic chemistry and organic chemistry. Chemistry 10 prepares students to take the General Chemistry sequence (Chemistry 11 and Chemistry 12). It additionally serves as a basic chemistry course for the allied health majors (such as nursing and physiology). It also serves to fulfill general education requirements. Students who successfully complete this course will understand basic chemical principles and will have practiced quantitative reasoning and problem solving skills. Students will also have learned various lab techniques, including the safe and competent handling of chemicals and laboratory equipment.

How to Apply

SMC SUMMER INSTITUTE FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

STEP 1: Apply to SMC Online

You will need an email account to register. You may use your own personal account or an account through a web-vendor such as yahoo. Once you have an email account and are ready to register online for your SMC classes, log on to the Web and follow the instructions below.

- 1) Go online and visit the SMC website at www.smc.edu/admissions/application.htm
- 2) Click on "Launch Online Application".
- 3) Read the "System Requirements" section to ensure that your hardware and software supports the registration process. Also, read the "Before you start the application..." to ensure that you have the proper documentation to complete the application process.
- 4) Click on "Start Application" at the bottom.
- 5) Keep in mind, for "enrollment status" you will click on "Special Admit, currently enrolled in K-12". For the residency section, keep in mind that all the questions pertain to your parents since you are under 19 years of age.

STEP 2: Personal Statement Form

Complete the SMC Personal Statement Form for Summer Institute for High School Students. If necessary attach a separate sheet for the essay.

STEP 3: Concurrent Enrollment Policies and Requirements Form & High School Concurrent Application Form

Fill out and obtain two required signatures on the Concurrent Enrollment Policies and Requirements Form and four required signatures on the High School Concurrent Application Form. A total of six (6) signatures are required on the two forms. THESE FORMS MUST BE FILLED OUT COMPLETELY.

STEP 4: Transcripts

Obtain your official high school transcript and submit it with your completed forms.

STEP 5: Assessment Results

If the program you are applying for requires an assessment please submit your results with the application. To take the assessment please call the assessment center at (310) 434-8040 or visit them online at www.smc.edu/assessment for sample test questions and assessment hours.

STEP 6: Mail Paperwork

Applications must be postmarked after March 31, 2009 to be accepted. No exceptions. Deadline to accept applications is May 30, 2009, or until class is filled. All applications must be submitted by mail to:

HIGH SCHOOL CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT POLICIES AND REQUIREMENTS

High School Concurrent Enrollment permits high school students the opportunity to enroll in courses at Santa Monica College or at the high school site for educational enrichment. The purpose of the program is to provide "advanced scholastic," "educational enrichment opportunities for a limited number of eliqible pupils" as defined by Education Code, Section 48800 and 76002.

Policies and Requirements:

- 1. High School Concurrent Students must have completed the 8th grade or equivalent prior to the beginning of the semester or term they plan to participate in the program.
- 2. High School Concurrent Students must complete all forms with their high school counselor who will help select classes that meet their educational needs. Students will only be permitted to register for classes that their counselor approves. Each form needs to be signed by the high school principal and counselor.
- 3. The local school district principal approval is required for a student participating in a home school program.
- 4. High School Concurrent Students must take the Mathematics placement examination if enrolling in courses where a specific mathematics proficiency level is advised or required.
- 5. High School Concurrent Students must take the English placement exams at SMC and meet any class prerequisites prior to the student's initial enrollment. To qualify to participate in the program, students must place into level B English, or higher. Students may be waived from the mandatory English assessment requirement when enrolling only in courses that do not have English skills prerequisites or advisories (ex: performance or activity courses).
- 6. High School Concurrent Students must have the signature of a parent or guardian authorizing the student's participation in the program.
- 7. High School Concurrent Students must submit a copy of their high school transcript along with the High School Concurrent Enrollment Application, prior to enrollment in each semester he/she wishes to participate.
- 8. Enrollment fees will be waived for high school students participating in High School Concurrent Enrollment; however, these students are responsible for paying non-resident tuition if classified as a non-resident. High School students are also required to pay for parking, course materials, books, and health fees. Associated Student Body representation fee and the Student ID fee are optional but must be paid for by the student if they wish to participate.
- 9. Students are limited to six units, or two classes, per semester.
- 10. Students will not be allowed to take courses in subject areas that the student previously received below a C grade (most recent attempt), whether taken at the college or high school level.
- 11. High School Concurrent Enrollment students will not be allowed to enroll in any physical education courses.
- 12. Credit courses are COLLEGE courses and will remain on the student's permanent record even if the secondary school uses the coursework as High School Credit. All coursework taken will appear on the student's Santa Monica College transcript. Students wishing to forfeit the college credit must file the College Credit Forfeiture Request form within the first two weeks of the term. This decision is not reversible. The coursework will still appear on permanent record, but college totals will be adjusted and course annotated to show forfeiture.
- 13. Courses offered are at the college level and instructors will teach at that level. Students may be exposed to and be involved in discussions of mature subjects.
- 14. Santa Monica College is not responsible for the supervision of minor students anywhere on campus outside of the classroom setting. Faculty are not expected to wait with students until their ride arrives. At times, classes may be dismissed early. Pay telephones are available on campus, but may not be in close proximity to the student's classroom.
- 15. High School Concurrent students must adhere to all college policies on course requirements, attendance, dates and deadlines, and any other applicable policies and procedures including the Student Code of Conduct. See college catalog or schedule of classes for policies.
- 16. Students must act on their own behalf. Parents, guardians, relatives or friends of Santa Monica College students are not permitted to enroll, drop, or add classes on behalf of the student. The same prohibition applies to requesting transcripts or grade verifications. Student records are protected under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA). Therefore, SMC will not discuss or release student information to anyone, including parents, without the student's signed written consent.
- 17. High School Concurrent Enrollment students may participate in extra-curricular activities only at the high school level.
- 18. F-1 and F-2 Visa students are not eligible to enroll as a Special Admit Student.
