Working With Violent, Disturbed and Personality Disordered People

This is an innovative programme linking high quality training with access to ongoing consultation. It is delivered in collaboration with the **Portman Clinic**.

The programme has been developed for professionals from a wide range of backgrounds in both adult and child & adolescent settings. The aim is to use an understanding of the emotional impact of disturbance to inform safe and effective practice and service management.

Each study day will link together into a programme that will increase the ability of staff to work with the most difficult people, whether in the health, social care, justice or other sectors.

Working With Disturbance

An inevitable part of the experience of working with high levels of disturbance is the degree of emotional reaction that is evoked in practitioners and teams. Formal inquiries into fatalities and reviews of system failure have highlighted both the gross and subtle ways in which this can impair the capacity to observe, analyse and act appropriately. The crucial importance of reflective practice is often emphasised and this programme shows how it is possible to manage and learn from disturbing emotional reactions in ways that inform and support safe, effective practice and service delivery.

This programme combines a theoretical framework for understanding disturbance integrated with research and clinical experience. It also provides access to ongoing consultation for individuals and teams drawing on the internationally recognised expertise of the Portman Clinic.

This Programme Will

- Enable participants to begin to apply relevant developmental and psychoanalytic concepts to their understanding of disturbed and disturbing behaviour.
- Provide a theoretical and experiential framework for linking the experience of working with disturbance and the dynamics of the organisational setting.
- Assist participants in further developing their approach to risk assessment and management particularly in relation to sexual violence and aggression.
- Engage participants in exploring disorders of personality development and the concept of untreatability.
- Develop participant's capacity for self-reflective practice and ability to work effectively with disturbing people.

Who is the Programme for?

Professional development for people working with violent, sexually threatening and disturbed individuals has been consistently identified as a training need and a gap in provision for both adult and child & adolescent services in health, social care and forensic settings. Individuals with complex needs arising from severe impairments in personality development are often supported in non-specialist community services and the workforce in these settings can feel particularly ill-equipped to respond to disturbed and disturbing behaviour.

This programme will therefore build the capacity of a broad range of professionals and services by enabling and supporting staff to work more effectively with difficult people and to manage the service context within which this work takes place.

In addition to staff from specialist mental health and forensic services this programme is designed to be accessible for participants from community mental health, social care, housing, probation and voluntary sector.

Outline of Programme

Study Days

There are three Study Days structured around a key theme. Each day will combine teaching with the opportunity to discuss clinical and practice experience within a confidential setting.

21st February | Risk - A Relational Approach

Traditional approaches to risk assessment are useful in identifying groups of individuals who pose a high risk, but such approaches can be rather blunt when formulating the risk profile for a particular individual. We will discuss elements of a psychodynamic model that are useful in risk assessment and offer a systematic approach to risk formulation. We emphasise the significance of childhood development, understanding violent and sexually violent acts, and the complex interpersonal processes involved in managing violent individuals. These dynamic processes between people impact on risk and risk perception, and can distort judgement if not recognised and understood.

27th April | Sex and Violence in Adolescents and Young People

In this workshop we will explore the efflorescence of sex and violence in adolescence. The particular features of adolescence as a developmental stage will set the scene. With the aid of relevant theory we will then look at different forms of aggression, which may be of a predatory kind, and also sometimes in the spontaneous outbursts of violence. The role of the group will be examined, both in its antisocial manifestation as 'gang' and in more benign forms where reparative and constructive processes become possible. The workshop will include film material and opportunities for participants to bring their own professional experiences.

3rd July | The "Untreatable" Patient

How do we understand the issue of treatability/untreatability when the simple dichotomy between the mad and the bad, as was prevalent 15 or 20 years ago, is now seen to be inappropriate? How do we develop our understanding and adapt our technique to accommodate especially demanding patients/ clients, adults and children, whose expression of their conflicts can often be very disturbing and difficult to those around them?
