4) When referring to something said or done by another person, give that person's name.

- 5) Refer to documents by the number given in the Document List.
- 6) Initial each page at the bottom and date and sign this statement at the end of the document.
- 7) Please type or print. Do not exceed 1,500 words or 6 pages for claims of \$5,000.00 or less, and 500 words or 2 pages for motor vehicle claims. The average typed page is 250 300 words.
- 8) List the names of your witnesses referred to in this statement.

## **EXAMPLE:**

- 1. On January 10, 20\_\_\_, I saw an ad in the Star-Phoenix describing a 1990 Dodge Document 1.
- 2. On January10, 20\_\_\_, I went for a test drive. The owner said it "was a good vehicle for its age".
- 3. On January 11, 20\_\_, I agreed to buy the car for \$2,500.00.
- 4. On January 11, 20\_\_\_, a Bill of Sale was drawn up <u>Document 2</u> and I paid the amount by cheque <u>Document 3</u>.
- 5. Two weeks later the car began to have transmission problems by jumping out of gear. I took the car to my mechanic who estimated the cost of repair at \$800.00 <u>Document 4.</u>
- 6. On January 30, 20\_\_, I spoke with the owner by phone but she refused any further involvement.
- 7. In February, 20\_\_\_, I had the transmission fixed for which I paid \$800.00 Document 5.
- 8. I then sent a Demand Letter to the owner for reimbursement of my expenses <u>Document 6.</u>
