



The Feinstein grant that we have participated in for many years is no long available.



GOOD NEWS!!! We have secured a new donor that will give the same percent of donation that we received with the Feinstein Grant -- the C.A.R.D. challenge. Along with monetary contributions, each pound of food equals a dollar. Your giving will determine our donor's contribution. This grant drive has supplied 25% or more of our budget and pantry needs in the past years.

For the congregations willing to participate we will be distributing bags that can be taken home and filled with food and returned for the center. We encourage people to refill the bags several times during March and April if they are able. However, if each family would bring a bag of food at least once during the drive, it would be of tremendous help.

We encourage each congregation, or a group within each congregation, to take on this very worthwhile project. An example would be for the youth of each congregation to bring food donations that could be used to create a structure (such as a pyramid or sky scraper) out of the canned goods brought in. The winning congregation would be recognized in a special way.
