

### World Malaria Day April 25

World Malaria Day is April 25. Since the ELCA Malaria Campaign joined the global movement to fight malaria in 2009, we have seen a reduction in the number of deaths from this preventable, treatable disease. But we're not done yet. We are committed to raising \$15 million by 2015 to support work in 13 of our companion churches in Africa to prevent, treat and contain Malaria by 2015, and to date, total gifts have reached over \$10 million. Through our existing relationships, plans and projects are being developed and implemented as we move faithfully



forward.



Globally, 3.3 billion people in 106 countries are at risk of malaria. In 2009, 781,000 people died from malaria, mainly women and children in Africa.

According to the latest estimates from the World Health Organization (WHO), released in December 2013, malaria mortality rates have fallen by 45% globally since 2000, and by 49% in the WHO African Region. Malaria mortality rates among children in Africa have been reduced by an estimated 54% since 2000.

There have been challenges in creating a successful malaria vaccine and drug resistance has developed to some of the drugs formerly effective against malaria. To date there is no licensed vaccine available so prevention efforts are critical.

### **Totally Ordinary**

It can be tempting to praise acts of generosity as exceptional or saintly. Jesus reminds us, however, that we should not be amazed by giving. Instead, he tells us that giving should be normal because humans are designed to give to help meet the needs of those we love. Stewardship, then, is not about being extraordinary. It is about becoming more human and more like the people God created us to be. When we recognize our own generous spirits, we will more fully trust God to provide.
