



Lemonade in the Shade



Lemonade in the Shade is scheduled to resume *May 24* immediately after the combined summer service. Once again, we are asking for bakers to contribute to this event by providing four dozen cookies. Four cookie bakers are needed for each Sunday beginning *May 24* and continuing through *August 30. Also, 2 servers are needed each Sunday*.

Signup sheet is in the office or the connector. You may also contact the church office, 546-5829, ext. 110.

Cookie Bakers: 4 Bakers per Sunday

Each baker is asked to provide 4 - 5 dozen cookies and place on the table in the connector prior to worship service.

Servers: 2 servers per Sunday

Lemonade set-up usually requires **20-25** *minutes*. You may choose to set-up tables prior to the service, or leave the service early. Please make note of the time involved to place cookies in baskets, retrieve lemonade from kitchen, and place items on the tables.

- <u>Tables (2), trash cans (3) and a blue plastic container</u> holding serving items, are located in the stairwell directly across from the elevator.
- <u>Blue container holds</u> tablecloths, baskets for cookies, doilies, napkins, napkin holders, cups, serving gloves, trash bags, sugar free cookies, note card holders (to identify sugar free cookies, or cookies with peanuts), zip lock bags.
- Lemonade will be in the refrigerator in the kitchen. Two containers of Regular lemonade will be in the containers with yellow lids, these have matching bases on which to set the containers. The One container of Sugar-free lemonade will be the one with a black lid, it also has a matching base. Please take two pitchers of ice water, along with the lemonade, to the serving table.
- <u>Cookies should be on the table in connector.</u> Baskets are to be lined with the large white napkins or doilies. Fill with cookies and place baskets on tables. Please label the containers of the cookies containing peanuts, nuts, or sugar-free cookies.
- <u>Leftover cookies can be placed in zip lock bags and left on the kitchen table</u>. Place leftover lemonade in the refrigerator. Leftover items will be used throughout the week with the children. You do not need to wash the lemonade containers. Please rinse, and leave in the sink. We will run them through the dishwasher on Mondays.

One last note, we love to see our children involved with service to others. So, if you have your children helping you serve, please make sure they wear gloves and are supervised. We want to train them in every good work and deed.

There is a single text listed for each weekday and Saturday; the Sunday texts are the Old Testament, Epistle and Gospel lectionary selections that are incorporated into our worship services (Note: during the time between Easter and Pentecost, the Old Testament lesson is replaced by a reading from Acts). One suggestion for daily reading would be to engage with the text through a process known as "Lectio Divina" (a Latin term that simply means "Divine Reading").
