Wednesday, March 5th, Mr. Bryan van Sweeden, Manager of the Keystone Grant Program administered by the Historical and Museum Commission of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, visited and inspected the Muhlenberg House. Members of the Restoration Committee, Dr. Ivan Hess, Alfred Douglas, Mary Hundertmark for her husband Eric, Dr. John Shetler, and Eric Hess, were present.

Mr. van Sweeden was pleased with the fine work accomplished and encouraged the Muhlenberg Committee to finish the interior.

We thank all our friends who contributed \$100,000 to match the Keystone Grant and the Historical and Museum Commission for awarding the grant.

Now our 1997 Goal is to raise funds to complete the interior of the house.

From The Journals of Henry Melchior Muhlenberg 1780

March 4, Saturday. In the forenoon a noncommissioned officer of a corps of light cavalry came to me and asked whether I could take in some horses and men; seventy cavalryen were coming through here on their march to Charlestown, South Carolina. We could not serve them because our house and stables are already occupied, nor do we have any hay or oats. It is a so-called Independent Corps under a Frenchman, Col. Mons. Armand. They quartered themselves in various houses in the neighborhood.

March 5, Sunday. Last night I had another dream about the vexatious unrest in Philadelphia. The weather is pleasant but the roads are still muddy and bad. A deacon let me ride his horse to Augustus Church, where I preached to the congregation on the spiritual agony of our most blessed Redeemer in the Garden of Gethsemane, based on the harmony of the Evangelists. I promised to conduct service a week hence and came home on foot. The light cavalry, or hussars, as one says in Germany, rode on this forenoon. I read Mr. Thomas Pyle's Paraphrase of the Epistle to the Hebrews; it is exceedingly fine.

March 6, Monday. In the forenoon a major arrived with a servant and two horses. He is going to Virginia with the general. Registered for marriage: Conrad Schmidt, single, and Margretha Baussman, also single, both of New Providence. She is the sister of Carl Jung's wife. The rest of the time was spent as usual.

Inaugural Muhlenberg Leadership Roundtable

On Wednesday, April 2, 1997, the Muhlenberg Leadership Committee will host the first in a series of Leadership Roundtables to be held in the Muhlenberg House on Main Street in Trappe.

The Roundtable will bring together a group of about twenty men and wome from the Perkiomen Valley to begin a conversation on leadership needs in this period of rapid change. The Committee, an activity of the Trappe Historical Society, envisions this Roundtable as the first of many such conversations at this historic site. The event is being sponsored by Harleysville National Bank.

The Committee's stated mission is "to positively affect our community and society through leadership development for persons of social responsibility as demonstrated through ancestral and contemporary leaders." "The Committee is pleased to hold the inaugural Roundtable in pursuit of this mission in the restored House," stated Lucy Ivins, Committee Chair. "Through this and subsequent Roundtables, we aim to have an ever-deepening influence on the quality of life in the Perkiomen Valley and beyond."

This first Roundtable, led by Richard P. Richter, will address the question: Are there constants of leadership in our time of constant change? The Roundtable members will participate in a search for a set of key changes that will make our community and our society better in the years just ahead. It will then seek agreement on the qualities, attitudes, and actions of leaders needed to make these changes come about, and, finally, determine the next question to address at a future Roundtable.

Richter, who led Ursinus College for eighteen years before becoming President Emeritus in 1995, was the 1994 recipient of the Muhlenberg Leadership Medal.
