Dear families and friends,

This weekend will see a long weekend for all of us as ANZAC day falls on Monday 25th April. It is a great opportunity to reflect on the courage of our armed services and their commitment to protecting our freedoms in conflict throughout the years and around the world. Recently, I received some precious documents relating to the service of my great grandfather who served as a gunner in the army during World War I. The most fascinating item was a journal that he kept as he travelled home by ship at the end of his service. For me, it created a very personal connection to the events of 100 years ago and I hope that, as we discuss this aspect of our history both at school and with our families, we are able to identify with the real people who represent such a huge concept of war and conflict. I will certainly treasure my great grandfather's words and have a better understanding of what that time was like for those who served.

2017 PREP ENROLMENTS

At this time of the year we receive interest from parents who are looking to enrol their children in next year's prep classes. Currently we are making contact with local preschools and childcare centres with information about the enrolment process. This year we are offering "Come and Play sessions" where children can visit and play in the prep classrooms and meet some of 2016 teachers. These sessions will take place on **Friday 29th April from 9:30**

<u>- 10:30am</u> and <u>Thursday 12th May from 4:00-5:00pm.</u> We are also inviting prospective parents to attend an evening information session and school tour at <u>7.15pm on Tuesday 3rd May.</u> In addition, we are booking school tours during school time which gives families an opportunity to see the school 'in action'. Please contact the office for more information about booking a tour.

In the meantime, if you, or someone you know, have a four year old and you wish to enrol in prep for next year, we are more than happy to meet with you. Please note that your child must turn five on or before 30th April, 2017. To complete the enrolment, you are required to bring along a Birth Certificate and the School Immunisation Certificate that should have been sent to all families with a four year old who has completed the prescribed immunisation program. Further information re immunisation can be obtained from the school or the local city council office.



Bartooning.











Cartooning is a special way of making comment on life and society. It includes humour and uses that to make comments that would be unacceptable or even politically dangerous if put into words. Cartooning uses exaggeration to add emphasis and since it deals with human beings it often exaggerates their body features, feelings, habits, faults.

In this unit, you will develop cartooning skills such as facial features, comic strips and speech bubbles. You will write humorous captions and learn how to tell a concise message in 5 points. You will explore your sense of humour, initiate the ridiculous but be sensitive to other people's feelings and consider the rights of free speech versus rights to privacy. Explore your creative talents with WiseOnes.

WiseOnes is a program for fast learners from Grades 1-6. It operates during school hours, in small groups. It provides students with an opportunity to mix with other creative thinkers, be challenged and have fun. There is a levy of \$216.00 for the term. Children work in very small groups (in 8 one-hour sessions), as this is a differentiated curriculum for special needs. The levy is payable to the school in the first week of term.
