Fact: 1 in 7 people in the US do not have enough food; 1 in 4 people
in Rockland live at 200% of poverty or below; that equates to a
family of 4 making \$40,000 or less per year

Myth: Rockland's pantries are well staffed & funded Fact: More than half are operated by volunteers and their budgets are expected to be cut significantly in 2015.



Forms of Consecrated Life

We are within the Year of Consecrated Life in the Universal Church and I want to dedicate this article to this topic. The reasons behind this are not only the fact that Pope Francis, who declared the Year of Consecrated Life, is coming to New York in just two short weeks but also due to the fact that we have two consecrated women on the staff of our Parish. Yes, that's right, two consecrated women.

You are very aware of Sr. Pat Hogan who two years ago celebrated her fiftieth anniversary in consecrated life. Sr. Pat is a member of the Dominican Sisters of Sparkhill and has taken vows of poverty, chastity and obedience. These vows are more formally called the evangelical counsels because they call a woman (or man) in religious life to live the virtues and counsels of the Gospel in concrete ways and in holiness of life. Along with the vows, religious live a specific charism that guides their ministry and service to the Church. In the case of Sr. Pat, the Dominican Sisters of Sparkhill have a specific goal of the proclamation of the reign of God through a ministry for justice.

The other consecrated woman on our staff is Nancy Doran, our Faith Formation Director. Nancy is a widow and in recent years has discerned a call to consecrated life. As a result, she has joined a religious community called the Society of Sister for the Church. Officially established by ecclesiastical authority in 1976, these sisters live as vowed religious women as they work for and with the people of God, the Church. They are under the direction and sponsorship of the Bishop of Paterson, NJ as their ecclesiastical authority. This Society allows women to live alone or with others but not a communal lifestyle with no "corporate property" (meaning that property and possessions are still owned by the individual woman). As celibate women, the Society of Sisters for the Church live prayerfully and simply and dedicate themselves, through private vows of celibacy, obedience and poverty, to serve the apostolic needs of the Church.

Please pray for these women as they live out their consecration to God for us and the whole Church. May many more women follow in their footsteps for the future of the Church and the Kingdom of God!


