

Orientation Leader Job Description and Application

A University of Baltimore **Orientation Leader** motivates incoming freshmen, sophomore, and transfer students by providing them with assistance in the areas of campus engagement, academic study, and networking opportunities, in addition to easing their transition into the UB community. **Orientation Leaders** will begin working with new students during the transition period starting July 1st and concluding November 1st. **Orientation Leaders** create a positive impression on the overall UB experience through their connections to the incoming students.

Each **Orientation Leaders** will gain professional and leadership experience, as well as develop friendships and connections. Stipends, based on the satisfactory completion of all required tasks and duties will be awarded in the range of \$400.00 (for new OL team members) or \$600.00 (for returning OL team members). Specific amounts for stipends will be determined after University budget approval.

Orientation Leader Requirements:

- Be a full time undergraduate student with a GPA of 2.5 or higher or
 - o a Graduate with a GPA of 3.0 or higher (transfer OL team only)
- Be able to work with a diverse group of people
- Possess a positive attitude, high energy level, and knowledge of and enthusiasm for UB
- Responsibilities Include
 - Attend two classroom training session focusing on practical and theory based training
 - Thursday, May 20th 9-12pm
 - Friday, May 21st 2-6pm
 - o Be available to participate in the Access UB Video filmed July 14th and 15th
 - 6 hrs per day
 - Assist in the planning of and participate in a summer event for transfer and incoming sophomore students. (This applies to the Sophomore and Transfer OL teams only)
 - Friday, July 23rd 8 hrs
 - Maintain office hours as assigned hours will be flexible with vacations
 - 5-10 hrs per month
 - Be available the week of Access UB Preparation days (Aug 16-18), shifts will be assigned after training
 - 5-8 hrs total
 - Freshmen and Sophomore OL's participate fully in Access UB August 19th August 21st the 20th is a preparation day.
 - Aug 19th 4 hrs
 - Aug 20th 10 hrs
 - Aug 21st 10 hrs
 - Transfer OLs participate fully in Access UB August 19th, 20th and 21st
 - Aug 19th 4 hrs
 - Aug 21st 10 hrs
 - Aug 24th 4-5 hrs

- o Participate in at least one (1) welcome week activity
- Freshmen and Sophomore OL Teams attend the wrap-up session with assigned students, date subject to change, CSI will be flexible with school schedules
 - October 26th 12pm to 2pm and/or 3pm to 5pm
- Contact assigned incoming students
 - Make 1 initial phone call using the phones supplied at UB to new students
 - Make 3-5 email and/or phone contacts before classes start including reminders to RSVP and attend
 Access UB until August 20th
 - 10 hrs
 - Arrange weekly contacts with your assigned students, to begin the week of August 30th and to conclude
 November 1st, these contacts may include meetings in individual or small groups
 - 10 15 hrs
- Complete all contact paperwork/logs on time
- Stay up to date on current events at UB and the surrounding community
- Other duties as assigned

Orientation Leaders will report to their assigned **Orientation Leader Team Captain** as well as reporting to Joe Slider, Student Activity Coordinator, or ARC Staff member (*if on the transfer OL Team*).

If you are interested in becoming an **Orientation Leader** please complete the attached application and submit it to the Rosenberg Center for Student Involvement, Student Center Room 303. The application deadline is Monday April 6th at 6pm. Interviews will be conducted on a rolling basis and all students selected to become **Orientation Leader** will be notified by phone and email no later than May 8th.
