



John Barone is what you might call a NYSSCPA lifer. A member of the State Society since he first joined the profession, John has served and been served by the NYSSCPA for more than 30 years. A past President of the Nassau Chapter, John continues to participate at all levels of the Chapter and remains active with the State organization with a seat on the Board of

Directors and as a member of the its Audit Committee.

John credits his involvement in NYSSCPA through ongoing contact with Chapter leadership. Over the years, John has worked for or with six different Past-Presidents of the Nassau County Chapter, including current colleague Andy Cohen. Andy is Partner-in-Charge of the Long Island practice of Weiser LLP, where John is also a Partner. Jim Kinney, another partner in the firm's Long Island office, will be receiving the 2010 Distinguished Service Award from the Nassau Chapter. "It's not surprising that my interest was and continues to be cultivated by their example of involvement. In fact, the example of involvement goes back to my first job in public accounting working for the then past-president of the state society, Eli Mason.

Presented with the 2003 Distinguished Service Award by the Nassau Chapter, John is particularly proud of the contributions he made while serving as Community Affairs and Public Relations Chair. During his tenure at that committee, John helped to create the Ellen Gordon CPAs 4(a) cause 5k race to support local Long Island charities. The annual event, which will be held for the ninth time this year, now attracts in the neighborhood of 120 participants and has, over the years, raised close to \$100,000. "You never know what you are going to encounter when you hold an outdoor event," cautions John. "We've had rain, and in one year, a hurricane, but it takes more than a little rain to dampen our enthusiasm." A mix of accounting professionals and staff participate in the USA Track and Field Association certified event, as do outside runners. This year's race will held at 9am on Sunday, June 13th at Wantagh State Park. This marks the first year the race will be run in the morning and on a weekend, two changes John predicts will further increase attendance. Island Harvest, the hunger relief agency, is this year's designated charity. Here John gives a nod to his wife, Josephine, who, "over the years has done everything from registering runners to buying raffle prizes."

On the professional side, John has, "gotten back far more than what I've given to the Chapter. Of particular value to me has been the opportunity to present in front of a group time and again. Accountants are no different than anyone else in being hesitant to speak in front of a crowd, but it's now almost second nature for me to address a group. Not only have I gained confidence and presentation skills—I've become more competent in various practice areas – because you'd better know your stuff if you're going to make a presentation to an audience of professionals." John also heads up the Chapter's High School Outreach program, and is a regular presenter to the next generation of accountants—high school students. "I meet with high school accounting classes to help them understand the profession. Our goal is to dispel myths about what accountants do on a daily basis and stoke their desire to pursue careers in the profession."

An effective demonstration ignited John's own interest in the accounting profession. "I had signed up for a college level accounting course in high school. The first day of class the instructor, when asking us what we thought accounting was all about, pulled out a good-sized wad of cash. 'It's about money,' he said. That got my attention. I've been interested in accounting ever since.

Many people initially pursue accounting because they are good at math. But these days, the math portion is less important than personal skills, consulting abilities and professional involvement, all of which can be sharpened at the Chapter."

During his tenure as Chapter President, John made it a point to push the two committees representing the staples of the industry--auditing and accounting, and taxation. "There is so much to be gained by getting involved with these two practice areas. The all-day seminars the Chapter hosts are particularly valuable--whether you're attending or making a presentation. It's an opportunity available for all members to take."

Looking back on his years in the Chapter, John is pleased with, "the investment of all the effort I put in over the years. The Nassau Chapter continues to progress with the changing times. Today's Chapter is more vibrant than it has ever been."

COMMITTEE SPOTLIGHT Practice Continuity

Did you know that among CPAs practicing in New York, the vast majority work in small firms or as solo practitioners? What this means is that a great number of CPAs have an urgent need for a solid practice continuity plan. Working as a solo or small firm practitioner is satisfying, but challenging work and for many CPAs, their practice is their largest asset. If the unexpected occurs and a CPA is out of commission, even for a relatively short time, the impact on his or her business can be devastating.

Take the example of a CPA who had emergency bypass surgery on March 15, the corporate filing deadline. Because of his continuity plan, a friend was able to cover for him during a critical period. Absent that contingency, his practice might have suffered irreparable damage.

It's not enough to have a plan—it has to be a workable plan. That is where the Nassau Chapter's Practice Continuity Committee can help. In the 18 months since its inception, the Committee has held quarterly meetings to address member concerns and facilitate a dialog between members. "During each meeting we share problems and concerns, and offer potential solutions," says Craig Morris, CPA, committee chair. "For example, two small firms really can't help each other because their resources are stretched to begin with. A small firm needs to partner with a slightly bigger one to make a continuity plan work. We generally discuss these issues and address how members can help members, either through shared resources, covering their accounts—whatever might be."

The Committee was formed in 2008 and often employs resources available through the AICPA, among others. "Practice continuity resources existed through NYSSCPA many years ago but they were eliminated, "Craig explains. "We got a tremendous response from the Chapter membership when we floated the idea of forming this committee."

Attendance at the Committee meetings has been steadily rising since its first organizational meeting in June 2008, making it not only the newest committee but also one of the largest. Among the featured speakers have been: Attorney Neil Katz, who addressed the legal aspects of continuation agreements and Mark J. Koziel, CPA, Director of Specialized Communities and PCPS/Firm Practice Management at AICPA, who outlined a recent succession survey and explored topics including different firm succession options, succession best practices, succession strategies by firm size and getting your firm succession ready.

The committee has also launched a Yahoo Groups website loaded with valuable resources from AICPA and other accounting groups pertaining to CPA succession and practice continuity including magazine articles, links to important websites and a sample practice continuation and emergency assistance agreement. Members can also upload information they've found to be beneficial to the website so that they can share with others.

Helping Craig run the committee are co-chairs Larry Bloom and Anthony Basile, and Eliot Lebenhart. "We're extremely pleased with the response to the committee," concluded Craig, "but there is still a significant group out there we hope to bring in. No one plans to have a disabling accident or medical condition, but it's a fact of life that any of us can take ill at any time. Statistics for the Nassau Chapter indicate that 63% of us are 50 or more years old. This means we have to think about the unexpected."

Nassau Chapter Practice Continuity Committee

On January 28, 2010 we were quite fortunate to have Mark J. Koziel, CPA, Director of Specialized Communities and PCPS/Firm Practice Management at the AICPA as our special guest speaker. His topic was "Succession Planning for the Future of Your Firm." Mark was named among the "Top 100 Most Influential People in Accounting" by *Accounting Today* in 2008 and 2009 and it was clear why. He gave a presentation that

was applauded as excellent and he fielded the tough questions on success planning. Mark also distributed a Tool Kit for Staffing Solutions, which is part of the AICPA Human Capital Center. The toolkit, normally available only to PCPS members, includes 11 booklets on Developing High Performance Teams, Team Recruitment, Strategy and Planning, Generational Issues, Work/Life and Team Retention and other matters related to leadership, management and growing a CPA firm. For those of you who were not able to attend this meeting, we will offer a limited number of these tool kits at our next meeting to those who register and request one in advance (see coupon below).

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Year-end Tax Planning & Business Valuation **Technical Committee Meeting**

Last year brought about a tremendous amount of new tax legislation and much more is expected in 2010, making last December's joint technical session, "Year-end Tax Planning Strategies and Business Valuation Discounts and Recent Related Tax Court Cases," sponsored by the Estate & Personal Financial Planning and Taxation Committees, particularly relevant.

Joseph Ammirati, CPA, ABV, CFF, ASA, Partner of Klein, Liebman & Gresen, LLC and Robert Schaffer, CPA Tax Manager of Castellano, Korenberg & Co., CPAs, PC were the speakers for the session.



Presenter Joseph Ammirati discussed business valuation discounts and estate & gift tax court cases.

Mr. Ammirati gave a presentation on business val-

uation discounts as well as an update on estate & gift tax court cases. He began his presentation defining the types of valuation discounts and cited a number of important and relevant tax court cases from 1955 to present. He also cited FLP cases relating to Cash & Marketable Securities holding companies and Real Estate holding companies. The scheduled one hour meeting was not enough to even scratch the surface, so Joseph offered to send the participants a PDF of cases presented to anyone requesting a copy.

Robert Schaffer elaborated on the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act and Worker Homeownership and Business Assistance Act of 2009. His accompanying handout was comprehensive and included over 65 slides, only some of which could be discussed in the time allotted. The topics presented included the Making Work Pay Credit, First Time Homebuyer Credit, and American Opportunity Tax Credit. Mr. Schaffer also pointed out the AMT provisions that are effective only for the 2009 tax year and spoke about bonus depreciation, Section 179 and auto deductions.

The December 10, 2009 Joint Session was made possible by the efforts of Elizabeth A. Eckert, JD, CPA, Caroline Murphy, CPA, and Christine Hallahan, chairpersons from the Estate & Personal Financial Planning Committee, and Stephen Ng, CPA, Robert Schaffer, CPA and Robert S. Barnett, CPA, Esq. from the Taxation Committee.

57th Annual All-Day Tax Conference

This year's Nassau Chapter event took place on December 5th and was repeated on the 6th. The topics were current, relevant and insightful, resulting in a very well attended gathering.

The conference began with opening remarks from our chairper-

sons, Stephen Ng, CPA and Robert J. Schaffer, CPA, and the day unfolded with many interesting facts from all of our astute speakers.

Diane Giordano, CPA and **Jack Angel, CPA** reviewed many aspects of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 for businesses and for individuals. They discussed changes to Section 179, bonus depreciation, NOL carry-back periods, COD rules, small business stock, work opportunity credits, homebuyer credits, AMT patch, education credits, energy credits and many other topics.

Bernard A. Krooks, CPA, LLM, CELA and Ellyn S. Kravitz, JD, LLM, CELA, followed by instructing us on the eligibility requirements for Social Security, Medicare and Medicaid. They also mentioned how asset transfers affect Medicaid and not home care eligibility.

NYS Tax Compliance was presented by **Mwisa Chisunka**, senior tax policy analyst with NYS Dept. of Taxation and Finance. Small business compliance issues such as sales tax, withholding tax and record keeping were among the updates. The new Metropolitan Commuter Transportation Mobility Tax was discussed at length due to the many concerns and questions regarding procedures and forms.

The NYS Dept. of Taxation and Finance's first ever taxpayer rights advocate, **Jack**

Trachtenberg, Esq., spoke on the purpose of his position and his future goals. Jack intends to provide direct assistance to taxpayers, address system advocacy and improvement, report on problems and recommend reform. Practitioners now have the opportunity to send him certain client cases the NYS tax department is evaluating unfairly or is unable to resolve.

Ronald M. Finkelstein, CPA, JD, raised several issues that apply to most divorced taxpayers, such as filing status, dependency exemp-

tions, alimony and alimony recapture, sale of home, the transfer of appreciated assets, and transfer of interest in retirement plans.

Karen J. Tenenbaum, CPA, Esq. and Yvonne R.Cort, Esq. followed with the definition of a NYS and NYC resident and the partic-

> ular tests that must be met, the domicile test and the statutory resident test. Practitioners listened to many interesting and entertaining case studies that applied these tests, resulting in unexpected resolutions.

> **Robert S. Barnett, CPA, Esq.** who is also a committee chair, discussed the 2009 change in the built in gains tax which was temporarily reduced to seven years from 10. He also discussed S corp eligibility and S corp status termination as well as the benefits of a Qualified Subchapter S Subsidiary and the importance of basis calculations in determining taxable events. Mr. Barnett cited several recent cases in which the IRS challenged these issues.

> Several estate planning tools and cases were cited by **Robert S. Lusthaus, CPA, Esq.**, who also introduced new gift and estate tax limits, such as the 706 exclusion amount of 3.5 million for the year 2009. Practitioners were made aware of the benefits of discounts used for private corporate stock on gift tax returns.

> The final presenter, **Mark Plostock**, **CPA**, presented the new NYS tax rate schedule for individuals. Mark discussed sales and use tax changes for businesses, partnership filing fees, changes in mandatory first installments and revisions in tax credits. A summary of New Jersey and Connecticut tax changes was included. Mr. Plostock also treated the audience to a clip of David

Letterman's, "Top 10 Things That I've Learned From Being An Accountant."

Our 57th annual tax conference was by all accounts filled with a tremendous amount of information applicable to all tax practices. Our large audience stayed faithful to the end and we all parted with CPE credits, many laughs and a day well spent.
