11. **LECTURE - #3 Lecture on the Harlem Renaissance 20 pts.**
12. **READ A POEM OR LISTEN TO A SONG - Select a poem from one of the Harlem Renaissance poets OR select a Jazz or Blues Song from this time period and copy the words or lyrics. If the song is instrumental or you want to do extra credit, link the music site or put it on a cd so I can listen to it. Read about the author and the poem or song and write an analysis of the poem or song. \* You may do the same thing using a photograph, short story, and painting. After you write a half page about the meaning of the piece then add your opinion of the piece and what you think it means or says. \*Remember to cite the information. 30 pts.**

### **The Woman's Movement**

**13.VIDEO – Watch the film *Iron Jawed Angels* and then write a thematic persuasive essay on the themes of the film. Cite the essay correctly and look on the web site for the citation information. 30 pts.**

**14.LECTURE – #4 Lecture on the Woman’s Movement 20 pts.**

**15.RESEARCH – Go on the web and research one of the leaders of the woman’s movement. After you have selected one of the women write a two page fact sheet on her life. It will be graded on the ideas and accomplishments of the woman not just when she was born, etc. Limit the biographical information. The woman can be born in 1810 to 1900. This can be a cut and paste assignment. Cite your source for the information you used. 20 pts.**

**16.TIMELINE – Create a time line for the Harlem Renaissance, The Twenties, or the Woman’s Movement. The time line should start no earlier than 1900 and end no later than 1930. The time line should have fifteen items on it and follow the rules of a correct time line. 20 pts.**
