Students develop the tools to be more discerning in the assessment of information pertaining to world affairs and to understand what it means to be a "global citizen."

- Have been enrolled for two consecutive semesters as a full-time student. (Fall 2012 and Spring 2013)
- Be a first year, full-time student planning to enroll in the Fall of 2013 at one of the participating institutions
- Have an overall GPA of 3.25 or higher
- Attend <u>ALL</u> orientation workshops.
- Citizen of the United States

Prospective Participants

- Complete and submit the application by March 1, 2013.
- Provide two recommendation letters.
- Write a brief one-page essay.
- Be prepared to be interviewed by a committee prior to final selection.
- For participants under the age of 21, an "Assumption of Risk" by a parent or guardian must be completed.
- Possess or agree to apply for a US Passport prior to March 1st.
- Possess or agree to apply for health insurance prior to March 1st.
