



Citizenship Application: Information and Documents to Bring

Please bring the following original documents to your 1st appointment:

FOR ALL APPLICANTS

- A copy of your permanent resident card (also known as your "green card)
- o Your driver's license or Texas State ID
- Your social security card

IF YOU ARE APPLYING AS THE SPOUSE OF A US CITIZEN:

- Proof of your spouse's US citizenship (such as birth certificate/ passport / naturalization certificate)
- Your marriage certificate, translated if necessary.

IF YOU HAVE EVER BEEN ARRESTED, CITED, CHARGED, DETAINED, JAILED, DEPORTED, OR ASKED TO APPEAR IN CRIMINAL COURT FOR ANY REASON AND/OR

IF YOU HAVE BEEN REMOVED, EXCLUDED, ASKED TO APPEAR IN IMMIGRATION COURT FOR ANY REASON.

- Court dispositions from the appropriate legal forum.
- o Arrest records if available
- All notices from Immigration / Department of Homeland Security
- Application for Asylum interview transcripts (if relevant)

If you are now married:

- o Your spouse's name

If your spouse is a US Citizen

Place and date your spouse became a US Citizen (Naturalization Ceremony)

If your spouse is not a US Citizen

- o Your spouse's A# (green card / immigration document number) if available
- Your spouse's country of citizenship
- Your spouse's immigration status

If you OR your current spouse were married before please bring

- o The prior spouse's name
- The prior spouse's immigration status
- The date of marriage
- o The date the marriage ended (by divorce, death, other)

If you have ever had children (including adult, deceased, adopted, step-children, living overseas etc.)

- o Child's name
- o Child's birthday
- o Childs A# (Immigration Document Number) if applicable
- o Child's country of birth
- Child's birthday
- o Child's current home address

If you have ever received a traffic citation, even if it was later dismissed or differed

- o Reason you received the citation

If you are a male who lived in the United States (with or without immigration status) between his 18th and 26th birthdays, please bring

o Verification of registration for Selective Service (available at www.sss.gov)

If you are low-income, you might qualify to have the filling fee waived. To see if you qualify and complete a feewaiver, please bring at least as many of the following as apply to you...

- o A copy of last year's federal income tax return, including all relevant W2s, attachments etc.
- A copy of your most recent Notice of Case Action from the Health and Human Services Department (this letter verifies that you receive SNAP(Food Stamps), Medicaid, or TANF.)
- o A copy of your most recent supplemental security income award letter.
- A copy of both pages of the HUD-59009, the federal rental assistance document found inside the lease of privately developed and federally subsidized apartment buildings.

Please bring the following items to your 2nd appointment:

- o Two Photos sized for a US passport (2 inches X 2 inches with white background)
- If not using a fee waiver, a check made out to "US Department of Homeland Security" for \$680 if you are under 75 years old, or \$595 if you are over 75 years old
