

Rob the diesel mechanic installed a new mixing elbow; the old one was almost totally clogged but you couldn't tell by looking at it. I just thought it was time to replace it as I've heard it can lead to a blown engine. Also after much time and head scratching, Will the electronics guy managed to get the AIS working. My chart plotter was not displaying the images although it was picking up dangerous targets. He fixed it finally by doing a soft ware update on my chart plotter, very weird. I started the engine early because the batteries needs charging. I needed to make water, and the wind was very low. After three hours, the alternator stopped charging the house batteries, It does good for short periods of time, That just leaves the wind generator and solar panels. I need to get to Cabo San Lucas fast. I should be there tomorrow morning.

Sunday, I got to the Cabo San Lucas fuel dock about 8:00 a.m.. They wanted an eighty dollar fee to get fuel. I did not pay it, but went to the other fuel dock with no fee, and got the best price I have gotten in Mexico this trip. The fellow even offered me a beer. He called a marine electrician

FROSTBITE SERIES RACE REPORT


The 2015 Frostbite carries forward. Three races have completed in a variety of wind conditions.

Race #2 in mid month, provided to be a challenge to the most patient of sailors. The winds started out in the 2-4 knot range, dropped to almost nil, but ripples on the water ahead inspired the fleet to continue. Finally, nearing 2 p.m., winds started picking up to 4-6 knots and at end of the course it built in the 10-12 knot range. Race two included a new high of six vessels on the water. New to our group, Sea Dancer, Sarah and Basil Machado. They had the guidance of Rex Keyes for their first experience. Vessels completing the race included ARIEL in 1st place, Un Bel Di in 2nd place, Sea Dancer in 3rd place and the Gulf Star in 4th. Turning in before completing the course were Willow



and Touché. A special guest crewman on ARIEL, was Member Bill Svboda, who has been away in Washington State.

Race #3 took place on the 28th, delighting all with decent and consistent breeze. Four boats started and finished this race. The pursuit start placed the vessels in the order of Un Bel Di, Sans Souci, Touché and bringing up the rear ARIEL. The course took ran upwind to ML7, out to ML4, over to ML3 and finishing between MILA and the green can. The race became eventful as the vessels rounded ML4, Sans Souci rounded 1st, Un Bel Di and Ariel battled for 2nd around, with Ariel coming thru ahead, Touché following in 4th a bit behind. As the boats headed toward ML3 running wing and wing, main



and jib only, Ariel took the lead from Sans Souci. None of the boats chose to fly spinnaker or Gennaker. The outcome of the race, saw Ariel in 1st place, Sans Souci in 2nd place a mere 40 seconds behind, Un Bel Di in 3rd and Touché finishing 4th, held a held high!

Two more races occur in April will complete the series. Race #4 scheduled for the 11th and Race #5 scheduled for the 25th. A reminder to all to refer to the EYC website for course information.

A bigger reminder is to consider participation in the 2015 Otter Cup which occurs in mid May, a lovely race down to Monterey and back. Sailing on Monterey Bay never fails to refresh and revive the magic in all sailors.

I have used here before for me. There were no slips available for me here, and I need electricity so I am meeting the electrician at Los Cabos Marina in Cabo San Jose at 7:30 a.m. tomorrow. I motored there and got a nice slip. I walked to town and got pesos and something to eat. My end tie is next to a Canadian couple I met in Ensenada. They came over for some wine and invited me to their boat for dinner of fresh tuna they caught, vegetables and pineapple all barbecued and brown rice. It was very good.

Monday, The electrician was here before eight, and fixed it before nine. A wire had broken. The boatyard was not very helpful. They could not do anything until tomorrow afternoon, and had no filters. They would get them next week from the U.S. I was just going to change the oil myself, but they did not have the right oil, so I checked out of the marina, and was under way at 11:15 a.m.

Tuesday, I am sailing as much as possible, even going just one knot or less until I have the oil changed. I also am tacking so going twice the distance slow will take more than twice the time.

Wednesday, a little more wind so a little faster, but still tacking.

Thursday, I have been seeing flying fish daily. This morning, thee was one on the deck.

Friday, March 13, 2015, it was windy today. I spent most of the day inside for comfort. The main sail was reefed almost all day. I reefed the jib sail in the late afternoon. I cleaned the engine sea strainer. This is the first time I have been able to open it, and I did it by hand. I also started closing the bathroom sink's sea cocks to keep sea water out which otherwise comes in when Bobby McGee heels a lot. I have not done that before. Just after sunset, I laid back in the cockpit, and looking up saw one of the shrouds is coming apart, and is half unraveled. I took down the sails to relieve the pressure on it, and am motoring to Bahia Tortuga which is about eighty miles away. I hope to get the oil changed there, and maybe filters before motoring the rest of the way to Ensenada. I can't sail until the shroud is fixed. I might do that in San Diego. Sincerely,


