SUPPLY COVER

Supply cover is available on most daytime courses. Only settings that are members of London Borough of Richmond upon Thames Early Years Development and Childcare Partnership qualify for supply cover funding.

The amount of funding will depend on the amount of supply cover a setting applies for over the term.

Claim forms will be sent to eligible settings at the start of term. Managers should complete these to confirm that costs have been incurred in order for staff to attend training. The form can be returned at the end of the term, or when the training has been completed.

We will double check the names on the register that the trainer will takes on the day.

We will monitor non-attendance at training and if your setting has three or more cancellations that have been made less than three days before the session, over the term we will invoice you for £75 to cover the cost of administering the cancellations.

We are very pleased with the way the Reflective Accounts are being used so far. As some settings do not have access to a photocopier we will return original forms with your certificate of Attendance and Reflection for your CPD file.

Your comments on the form are being noted and early years Advisory Teachers and Support Officers will follow up on these at their visits. Reflective Accounts should be used to demonstrate your continual professional development to your manager, Ofsted and your parents.

Those of you undertaking an NVQ can present these forms to your assessor as evidence of your knowledge and understanding.

We have added the training that is arranged by Cluster Groups to this term's programme.

The link teacher and cluster meeting programme was developed to provide early years practitioners working in the private, voluntary and independent sector access to a qualified teacher in the maintained sector.

The aim of the programme is to develop links between all early years practitioners, provide training, share good practice and in doing so ensure high quality and continuity of experience for young children.

We currently have 3 cluster areas in the borough: Barnes, Mortlake and Sheen, Kew, Richmond, Ham and Petersham and Twickenham and Whitton supported by 10 link teachers.

The cluster meetings will now be advertised in the termly training programme and will be open to anyone who wishes to attend. However, in some cases where numbers are restricted priority will be given to those practitioners in the cluster area.

We are currently taking names for the NVQ's that will start in September. Please contact me with your details. Bursaries are available for all childcare qualifications from level 2 and above, regardless of the training provider you use. To be eligible for a bursary you have to be working or volunteering in one of our settings.

We would like to run the 'Introduction to working in a Pre-school Setting' Level 1., Please let me know if you have any new members of staff who would benefit from this one term course and I will arrange it when we have sufficient numbers.

All of the training in the programme is relevant to current childcare qualifications.

Rather than stipulate the types of settings who can attend each training session, we have given each session a child age range so you can decide if it is appropriate for your setting or not.

We have renewed the subscriptions to *Practical Pre-school* for pre-school settings and Out of School providers will be receiving 6 issues of *Playwords* that we hope you will find interesting. Childminders will also be receiving copies of *Practical Professional Child Care* in the near future. Please let me know if you find these publications useful.

- Develop their skills
- Improve their knowledge
- Examine their *attitudes*
- Develop their reflective practice
- Increase their confidence

This means that by the end of our courses, participants should be able to leave with new techniques for achieving good practice underpinned by the theory to explain why it works. They should also feel good about themselves and the training course!

EVA TUTCHELL

Eva Tutchell had many years' experience as a teacher and Head of Department before the post she held for 13 years as advisory teacher for staff development and equal opportunities in Berkshire. She also spent 4 years at Southampton University where she was responsible for setting up and running the Gender Module on the MA Ed course.

Eva now works as a freelance consultant, providing courses on managing behaviour, citizenship, stories in the early years and managing the workload. Her main commitment is supporting Advanced Skills Teachers in three local authorities.

IAN CHAMBERLAIN

I was born to a family of two brothers and one sister in a small mining village called Huthwaite in Nottinghamshire, near junction 28 of the M1, my Father a coal miner and my Mother a shop worker, part-time and full time mum. I left school at 16 and followed in my Fathers footsteps and became a Coal Miner starting work as an apprentice at Welbeck Colliery in North Nottinghamshire. I took my full first aid qualification here at 16 and have held this ever since without break, not realising that at the time it would come in useful later and also the link into the fact that the award was via St John.

Left the coal mines in 1994 and started to work in leisure, gyms and pools, I started teaching here, first leisure then lifesaving and then lifeguarding. I went on to supervisor level and then moved to London in 2000 to take a position as a facility manager for Hammersmith and Fulham council. It was here I started to teach first aid after taking my instructor award, firstly teaching to the lifeguards then teaching paediatric first aid to the councils early years department. It was here that a contact was made to Richmond and the courses started around four years ago, firstly under Debbie's contact. I have also since taken several courses too for Hounslow NCMA at Feltham.

I left leisure in 2003 after a short spell for Aquaterra in North London, taking the plunge into full time teaching, firstly for myself only then joining St John, London District (Prince of Wales). I taught first aid as well as health & safety for two year, I took my first professional H&S qualification here and left here in 2005 after having to use my holidays to take my exams!

I now teach for HSS hire shops as the southern regional trainer, training staff and customers in scaffolding, abrasive wheels, steps and ladders, etc and importantly first aid which is St John franchised.

I have had real life experience in first aid, some of which in the coal mines would make your hair curl! But as I always say to all on the course all I ever ask is that you try to help, it will always make a difference. During teaching we always have a laugh and this helps the time go faster, even I get a little tired of working at weekends sometimes! The weirdest question I was asked was while teaching for St John, two hairdressers that were on a one day first aid course asked when they were going to get chance to use their scissors to perform a tracheotomy!! They had seen this on ER or Casualty and had even brought their scissors so they could practice!! What is it they say about hair dressers?

JANE WHITWORTH

I have a diploma from the Drama Centre, London and worked for many years as the Head of Acting and Productions in a drama school and also taught elsewhere in FE. I have run my own drama and music groups for children from two years upwards. I worked with an LEA in primary schools to develop a TIE programme investigating various anti-social problems, eg racism, stealing, bullying and graffiti.

I work as an educational consultant for various LEA's running inset days for teachers and other professionals. My areas of expertise are creative learning, bringing stories to life and the use of drama techniques including puppets, in personal and social education.

I run workshops for educational professionals on self development and stress management and have recently been involved in a longer term project addressing particular relationship problems within a school.

JASMINE PACH

I provide inspiration through training days and workplace support so that adults free up their thinking around children and play. I provide practical ideas that can be easily implemented indoors and out, at school and at home.

I help families to make sense of spontaneous play in the home and understand the value of it, particularly rough and tumble play and how this supports bonding and development. I look at the ways adults might inadvertently get in the way or shut the process down.

JULIE HOGBIN

Julie trains in all areas of management development. She works with new managers to increase their confidence and awareness and also enjoys working with experienced managers to enhance existing skills. Julie trains a range of management topics including appraisal interviewing, supervision skills, managing change, coaching and managing conflict.

Working in a consultancy role, Julie supports organisations with team development and works with individuals to increase personal awareness and efficiency through coaching.

Julie joined us in March 2004. She is an experienced management development specialist who has worked within training in both the public and private sectors for the previous 13 years. The three years before joining LEVELheaded were spent as an independent trainer working with organisations such as The Co-operative Group, Pricewaterhouse Coopers and The Department of Work and Pensions

NICOLA BURKE

Nicola Burke is an Early Years Music Specialist and has written and delivered *Music Matters* courses for various networks of the National Childminding Association and for various Early Years and Childcare Services across the country. The *Music Matters* courses support both the Birth to Three Matters Framework and the Foundation Stage; demonstrating how the Framework and the Curriculum Guidance for the Foundation Stage can be implemented using music. They also demonstrate how music can encourage all aspects of child development.

Nicola studied Theatre, including Theatre in Education at Royal Holloway University of London. Nicola plays the piano, keyboard and trumpet and has performed in various orchestras and bands both nationally and internationally. Nicola has been

teaching music since 1998 and in 2002 she began instrumental teaching at a special needs school and worked with a pre-school music company delivering music sessions for early years aged children.

Nicola has been working for Music Fusion, a Youth Music Action Zone since 2003 as an Early Years Music Leader, Trainer, Composer, Writer and Researcher. Music Fusion commissioned Nicola and two other Early Years Music Leaders to write an accredited course in Music for Early Years. The commission also involved the writing of a book titled *The Guide to Music for 0-3 Years* which comes with an accompanying CD.

PHILLIPA BURGE

Pippa is a Dietician and Registered Nutritionist employed by Kingston Hospital and works across both local boroughs of Kingston and Richmond. One of her many roles is to provide training to Kingston, Merton and Richmond Healthy Schools Scheme and advise on the nutritional quality and monitoring of school meals. She produced the Food and Nutrition Guide for primary schools with support from local teachers and parents. On a freelance basis Pippa has provided training to Wandsworth Early Years and Childcare Service as well as Kingston's Early Years Conference.

WENDY GREGORY

Wendy Gregory is a counselling psychologist with several years teaching experience. She offers counselling services in a number of schools, as well as a range of one day training workshops which she has delivered through schools, local authorities and educational companies. She can design training on practically any aspect of psychology, mental health or child development.

She is currently the Artist-Educator at the Fitzwilliam Museum, University of Cambridge, where she teaches people of all ages. She is passionate that, like Matisse, '...we have to nourish our feeling, and can only do so with materials derived from the world around us....' especially if we are to be imaginative, creative individuals.

BONNY ROBINSON


