Bill Hardman continues to have serious health concerns. He is on oxygen full time. Bill's great sense of humor helps him to do his best to carry on from day to day.



LUNCHEON - November 3, 2010

There were 62 Gyros, Gyrettes and guests at our Remembrance Day luncheon held at the Carriage House Inn. Gord Anderson gave the grace which was followed by two minutes of silence.

Following lunch Steve Denny, our Past President, installed Fred Thiessen, our newest member. Fred was accompanied by his wife Anne.

Pre sident John Hodgson spoke briefly about Curlarama, the Past Pre sidents' Dinner, and our annual charity bingo.

Bob Steele introduced our guest speaker A.J. (Tony) Foster who is currently serving in the rank of Captain with the G3 Operations and 2IC of the 41 CBG Battle School.

Captain Foster was deployed to Saraje vo from March 7, 2001 to Sept 17, 2001 as part of J6 at the Stabilization Force Headquarters at J6 SO/S1. During this period, he had the opportunity to participate in divisional level strategic planning where he worked with many of the NATO country representatives.

On February 2, 2007, Captain Foster transferred into the regular force and then into the infantry. He completed his mounted and dismounted infantry commander course in Gagetown, New Brunswick. He was subsequently posted to 1 PPC II in Edmonton on September 15, 2007. He joined the First Battalion when it deployed to Afghanistan in Oct of 2009 and he returned home on June 1, 2010.

Captain Foster spoke about his experiences in Afghanistan. He relayed the message that the Canadians were going to continue in Afghanistan with the goal of training the Afghanistan military. Captain Foster stressed that the Canadians are in Afghanistan to give support to the country, but not to occupy the country.


