Vikki is the author of 3 books, "Quilting Curves", "Quilting by Improvisation: Exploring Curves, Openwork, and Dimension," "Nurture Your Creative Spirit: Wisdom and Insight Learned Through the Art of Quilting", and a DVD "Crazy About Curves". #### Ohio Quilts!! 2014 Grant Recipient

Grants are made for specific events/projects that are open to the public and incorporate the mission of Ohio Quilts!! Grants cannot be made to individuals or businesses.

Groups should read all the grant materials carefully to determine if the type of event or project they are planning may qualify for consideration.

The OQ!! Grant program guidelines will be presented at the Annual meeting in September 2014.

# Midwest Study Group

There is a quilt group in the Midwest that has no officers, no written constitution and by-laws, and no articulated goals but they are thriving and you might be interested in hearing about them.

The Midwest Fabric Study Group is affiliated with the American Quilt Study Group but you don't have to belong to AQSG to belong to MFSG. Membership is over 100 and includes people with many different quilt interests. However, a primary reason for getting together is to share a show-and-tell of quilts over 100 years old at each meeting and learning how to date quilts by research, patterns, style, fabric, etc. Sometimes at a meeting they pick a theme for the show-and-tell such as signature quilts, crazy quilts, 1890 to 1900 quilts, etc. They also have at least one speaker at each meeting, sometimes more. Meeting dates usually fall on a weekend in March, May, August (study weekend, not to be missed) and November (often held in Shipshwana).

The biggest bonus for being a member is that MFSG is well respected and known by quilt scholars. Therefore, they always get to check out the quilt collections at each "weekend" city's history museum behind the scenes, in temperature controlled warehouses. They have a turning where sometimes dozens of antique quilts are piled on one table and turned over to another table when each quilt has been sufficiently examined. Boxes of nitrile gloves are provided so the quilts can be examined closely.

Although most of the members are from Ohio, Kentucky, Indiana, Michigan and Illinois, they also have members from six other states. There are other fabric study groups in the U.S. but this is the group that encompasses quilters, textile teachers, history buffs, etc. from Ohio. Most of the time (but not always) they meet in Indiana because it is centrally located. Some of the cities visited in the last two years include Richmond, Indiana; Ft. Wayne, Indiana; Springfield, Illinois; Lexington, Ohio; Kokomo, Indiana; Cincinnati, Ohio; and Grand Rapids, Michigan. The chairpersons at each weekend arrange for a motel.

Dues are a one-time \$10 and \$1.75 for a name tag. Usually an amount is collected at each meeting to cover the costs of a meeting place, coffee, etc. The amount depends on the expenses incurred and the number of people attending the meeting. There is a procedure for joining which is mainly getting your information and giving you the yahoo group's e-mail number for MFSG.

Naturally, it's a good idea first to attend a meeting to see if you think joining would be a good fit for you. Since they have no office and no officers, probably the best thing to do is contact Ohio Quilts!! member Joyce Foley (joyce.foley@twc.com) who can tell you where the next meeting will be and the contact name for that particular meeting.

## Concerned by the high cost of cotton fabric?

According to a May 2, 2014 online news article, *A Cotton – Polyester Blend: The New Fabric of our Lives?*, in the Wall Street Journal's Market and Finance Section, cotton has a shrinking share of the clothing market. Polyester is cheaper and it looks like China will be using cheaper fiber to produce apparel that recently has been 100% cotton. According to Jordon Lea, a cotton merchant in Greenville, S.C., "The cotton industry's market share is doing more than just shrinking – we're collapsing". Does this mean we may see lower prices for cotton in the near future to increase consumer demand, or might we see a cotton polyester blend on the shelves of quilt shops?
