From your Pastor's Desk Fr. Mike Eckley



Pastoral Council: This year we had four people that were going off the Parish Pastoral Council: Frank Cuellar, Tracy Potter, Zach Sauer, and Mary Jo Burns. I want to thank them for their dedication to the parish and their willingness to serve. This was not the first time that they had served on the Council and I appreciate their willingness to have served again.

We had four candidates for Parish Pastoral Council and I've appointed each of them to the Council. We are very fortunate to have a great group of people. They are: Jerald 'J' Aguilar; Max Engel, Grace Sossoukpe Tollo, and Dave Juszyk. I thank them for their willingness to say yes and serve the parish in such a generous way.

Ask the Pastor: Recently I was at a wedding out of town. During the reception I was speaking to one of the guest whose sons are currently in the seminary. She was talking about how much she has learned from her sons about basic Catholic Knowledge. She was raised Catholic and has been Catholic and involved in the Church all her life but as she has had discussions with her sons, she realized how much she didn't know or forgot. She mentioned how it would be nice to have a class on basic Catholic Knowledge. That may be something we may do here at St. Pius X in the future if there is interest in a class, but what I thought for now, is that I would invite questions from you about the things you would like to know regarding the Church and attempt to answer them here in this space. You are invited to submit questions to me via email at frmike@stpiusxomaha.org. If there is something you want to ask, I'm sure there are many others who have the same or similar questions.

In today's gospel we have the story of Jesus feeding the multitude with just a few small loaves and fish. It is found in the beginning of Chapter Six of John's Gospel. Over the next four weeks we continue to hear from John 6, known as *The Bread of Life Discourse*. With these weeks we will be reflecting more deeply on the mystery of the Eucharist. Since I have no questions currently, I thought I'd talk about different aspects of our Eucharistic practice these first couple of weeks. Today I'd like to talk about the proper gesture when we come into Church.

There are two appropriate gestures depending on where we are facing. The first is to bow to the altar. It is a gesture of reverence to the symbolic presence of Jesus found in the Altar. This is the gesture I use when processing to the altar at the beginning of mass and before processing out at the end of mass. At mass, the focal point of the celebration is the altar and so as we come in and before we go into the pew, it is proper to acknowledge the symbolic presence of Jesus with a bow to the altar. This is also done as you leave Church after mass.

The other gesture that is appropriate is to genuflect (go down on one knee) before going into the pew or as you are leaving after mass. This is a gesture to the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist which is reserved in the tabernacle. When doing so, you should be facing or looking towards the tabernacle and not the altar.

When I was a student at Our Lady of Lourdes, we were taught always to genuflect before and after mass. At that time the tabernacle was located right behind the altar. As our tabernacle is not located directly behind the altar, both gestures are appropriate, it just depend on where you are facing: the altar or the tabernacle.
