#### WHAT IS DIABETES?

Diabetes is a disease in which the body cannot properly store and use fuel (glucose or sugar) for energy.

Usually, but not always diagnosed in children, type I diabetes is considered to be an autoimmune disease. In Type I diabetes the cells that produce insulin are destroyed and, eventually, the pancreas can no longer produce insulin. Daily injections of insulin are required to sustain life.

Type II diabetes is a disease in which the pancreas does not produce enough insulin or can result when the body does not effectively use the insulin it does produce. Combinations of medications, diet and exercise (lifestyle) and sometimes insulin are required to treat type II diabetes.

Gestational diabetes is a temporary condition that affects two to four percent of all pregnancies and involves an increased risk of developing diabetes for both mother and child.

## **VET CHECKS**

Veterinarians will be checking for heart rates and any abnormalities as well as a lameness check. Each station will have ribbons for kickers and green horses.

Riders will not be asked to dismount for the lameness check unless necessary.

Assistants will hold your horse quiet but firm for the heart rate check. If horses are buddies, they may go to a vet station together.

All riders must have a hand stamp and must have numbers in plain view in order to get past the starter to begin the ride. Each horse must also have the rider number attached in order to identify a loose horse in the absence of a rider and subsequently locate the rider.

## CHECKPOINTS

Checkpoints are placed strategically along the trail. Please notify the checkpoint person of any difficulties you may encounter. All checkpoints are in contact with the farm for emergency assistance, both for horse and rider.

#### REMINDERS

This is a NON-COMPETITIVE event. We ask that you walk your horse at a leisurely pace and enjoy the day and the scenery. Please remember that there are many families with children who take part in this event. Please keep a safe distance and be courteous of others who are less experienced than yourself.

Use of trails is granted by special permission from private property owners. Please respect the property and follow the instructions on the trails. Do not throw garbage on the trails and please be careful to minimize crop damage along fields.

Every precaution has been taken to ensure the safety of both riders and horses. If you notice any problem areas on the trail please report them at the next checkpoint.

1. Stallions and kickers must wear red ribbons and be kept under control. Green horses must wear green ribbons.

2. Alcohol is not permitted on the farm or the trail.

3. If you must pass other horses, please do so at a walk.

4. Remain on the marked trail so as not damage crops or personal property.

5. Riders under 18 must wear a safety approved riding helmet.

6. Please clean all garbage you generate both on the farm and on the trail. No smoking on the trail or near the barns on the farm.

7. Barns on the farm are off limits with the exception of the registration areas.

8. In order to ride/drive you must, without exception be registered and visibly wearing a number.

9. All riding and carriage horses are required to under go a vet, tack and carriage check. Since locations for the two will vary, check with registration.

10. Double riding is at our discretion and subject to approval by Laura Martin, ride chairperson. In all approved cases helmets and proper tack are a must.

11. **Absolutely no dogs!** This is not an event conducive to bringing the family pooch. Please respect the safety of everyone, including your pet!
