stream health is a widespread, yet treatable epidemic contingent upon proper diagnosis and treatment of stream impairments. Diagnosing stream ailments is much like diagnosing human ailments... a team of professionals considers the symptoms and collects data to diagnose the underlying causes then develops a treatment plan. Proper diagnosis and treatment of stream impairments requires the skill and experience to properly identify the underlying causes. It is also crucial to implement a treatment or restoration plan that restores the long-term health and stability of the stream.

This workshop has been developed in recognition of the need for advanced training and practical experience for natural resource professionals in diagnosing stream condition and the underlying causes

of degraded health. This workshop includes: the fundamentals of river physiology and anatomy (hydrology, fluvial geomorphology, and ecology); the underlying causes and the resulting impacts to stream stability, water quality, and biodiversity; demonstrations of diagnostic tools; and practical experience gained by stepping through real examples including examples brought by attendees.
