CHICKENPOX

Chickenpox is a highly contagious virus. The disease is usually mild in children but can be more severe in adults and can cause serious illness. Signs and symptoms for Chickenpox are mild fever, runny nose, fatigue, small blisters on the skin or a general rash. Chickenpox is spread by coughing and direct contact with an infected person. People with chickenpox should avoid contact with others and not attend work, school or childcare until five days after the onset of the rash when all blisters have crusted and dried out.


