Born and raised on the West Coast, Laurel is well known in the San Francisco Bay area as an accomplished appliqué quilt designer. Her quilt designs are inspired by her love of nature as seen in her flower and natural landscape designs which include trees and mountains. She uses a mix of color, pattern and textures. The name

Whisper Color describes the technique Laurel uses to dye silk scarves. Laurel loves dyeing fabrics including silk scarves, wool and bamboo batting. Her work has been seen at West Coast quilt and guild shows. When her sons started

school she joined a local quilting group that made quilts for the Richmond Rescue Mission. They made the mistake of complimenting her on her use of color. 















BLOCK PARTY — AUTUMN LEAVES (9" block) — DUE OCTOBER OR NOVEMBER 2013

Leaf fabric: deep, rich jewel tones in fall colors.

Cut three squares $4'' \times 4''$ and three squares $31/2'' \times 31/2''$

Background: warm cream/beige/off-white tone on tones (no puire whites).

Cut two squares $4'' \times 4''$ and two squares $31/2'' \times 31/2''$

Half-square triangle units: (for 9" block)

* Place one 4" colored square and one 4" background square right sides together.

Draw a diagonal on the lighter side.

Stitch a scant 1/4" seam on both sides of the diagonal.

Cut apart on the drawn line.

Open each unit and press seams to the darker side.

Trim each half-square unit to 31/2", keeping the seams on the diagonal.









Repeat from * to make a total of four half-square triangle units..

Cut a 1" bias strip from the remaining colored square. **Stems:**


Sew the strip into a tube, right side out, with an 1/8" seam.

Insert a bias bar, or other 1/4" firm strip, and press seam to the back to make a 1/4" stem.

Applique the stem diagonally down the center of one of the background squares.

Join the units in rows of three and then join the three rows to create the leaf block as shown. Be sure seams lie in opposite directions when joining the rows.

The stem must be appliqued onto the bottom background square before joining.
