#### FROM THE SUPERINTENDENTS' OFFICE

De ar DAA Families,

As this is my first SPO IS message of 2015, I would like to briefly wish everyone in DAA's community a happy New Year! Two weeks ago I asked Matthew Wilding, DAA's deputy superintendent, to write this message. Matthew has been at DAA for only a short time, but we are already beginning to benefit from his experience, dedication, humility, and since rity. I asked Matthew to write our SPO IS article two weeks ago partly because I wanted to raise his profile among our parent community. He is an indispensable member of DAA's leadership team, and I certainly know how much I depend upon him!

I write this week from London where I am attending a teacher recruitment fair. This is how international schools like DAA identify and hire their teachers. The recruiting season in international schools hits its peak in January and February, when DAA's principals, assistant principals, and I do most of our hiring for the following year. There are nearly 700 seasoned international educators attending this London fair, and my job is to convince the best ones to join us at DAA in August. Most of the 700 teachers attending this recruitment fair currently work in other international schools around the world. Just yesterday, for example, I interviewed several great teachers presently working in Belgium, Brazil, Kuwait, South Korea, and the Philippines. All are ready for new adventures in their care ers and I'm doing my best to convince them that Dubai might be right for them.

In addition to the training and experience DAA requires, we're also looking for teachers who have the right mind set about children and learning. We want teachers who, above all, love working with children - compassionate educators who see every student as a unique person. We also want teachers who motivate and inspire students to give their best efforts in everything they do. The most brilliant teachers, in my opinion, are the ones who inspire a student to give her greatest effort and realize her potential, even on smaller tasks and assignments, not because of a grade or incentive, but because the pride, self-confidence, and integrity that child develops are their own enduring reward.

Two indicators suggest a lot about the type of school DAA is becoming. First, where are DAA's departing teachers taking new positions? Iam pleased to share that some of the best international schools in the world are lining up to recruit the best teachers from DAA who have declared themselves "free agents." In the last two years, schools such as United World College South East Asia, the American School of the Hague, Singapore American School, the International School of Manila, Shanghai American School, and the International School of Aberdeen (Scotland) have hire d former DAA teachers. DAA is recognized as an outstanding school on the international circuit, one that has high professional standards and expectations of its teachers and one that invests seriously in teachers' professional learning. Second, how successful is DAA at retaining its best teachers? Much credit here belongs to Robin Appleby, my predecessor as DAA's superintendent. When Robin became DAA's superintendent during the 2008-09 school year, DAA was the type of school teachers "visited" for two years before moving on. The average tenure of a DAA teacher at that time was around 2.5 years. Nearly six years later that number stands around 5.2 years, which is a dramatic change. So while it always saddens me to have an outstanding teacher move on from DAA, those numbers indicate that teachers are staying longer and investing more in our school And that's good for DAA's students.

There are great things happening at DAA, as this edition of SPOTS will surely reveal. Things never seem to really slow down around this school! My best regards again to your families as we begin 2015. Ithink we have another terrific year in front of us.






#### Stepping up to the Middle School:


