Message from the State President

The year 1813 saw major land and “sea” battles on the Ohio frontier, so it is hardly surprising that there are numerous War of 1812 bicentennial activities and commemorations planned in Ohio during 2013. Several of these events are listed on our calendar on page eight, including the various tall ship activities in late August, which culminate on Labor Day with the reenactment of the Battle of Lake Erie. (For additional information, please see www.battleoflakeerie-bicentennial.com) Perry’s Victory and International Peace Memorial at Put-in-Bay reopened to visitors last summer; there are ongoing exhibits and events scheduled starting this spring. (Please see www.nps.gov/pevi) The Battle of Lake Erie Bicentennial Commemoration, complete with parade, will be held at the Memorial on September 10th.

The 200th anniversary of the First Siege of Fort Meigs is right around the corner - May 3-5, 2013, at Fort Meigs State Park in Perrysburg. Re-enactors will give glimpses of camp life, musket and artillery demonstrations, battle reenactments, etc. (www.fortmeigs.org) The Ohio Society U.S.D. 1812 plans to have a booth at this once-in-a-lifetime event. And if these dates don’t happen to fit into your schedule, please consider joining us on June 13th for a U.S.D. 1812 road trip to Fort Meigs, complete with a special behind-the-scenes tour given by Director Rick Finch! Please see page six for details.

We are delighted to have **President National Virginia L. Apyar** as our special guest for State Council on March 22, 2013. Please make plans to attend State Council and welcome her to Ohio! We also have a special event planned after the conclusion of the business meeting - a trip to Mansfield’s 1812 Block House for a rededication ceremony and tour of the block house. I am definitely looking forward to touring the block house, as well as seeing the re-enactors in action ... complete with (hopefully) cannon fire!

If you have not recently taken a look at the Ohio Society’s online index to veterans buried in Ohio, please take a moment to do so. (www.ohiodaughters1812.org/graveindex) Thanks to some very dedicated volunteers, this index has grown from about 4,000 veterans to more than 9,000 in just the past year! A little over 1500 cemetery photos are now included on the web site. There are still many opportunities to become involved with this project, especially if you are interested in photographing veteran tombstones in a cemetery near you. Thanks to articles published in various Ohio newspapers this winter, we even have non-member volunteers contributing their time and photography talents to our project! I would really like to encourage each Ohio Daughter to become a part of the Ohio Society’s Bicentennial Project, documenting the War of 1812 veterans who are buried in Ohio.

**MINUTES OF THE STATE BOARD MEETING
OHIO SOCIETY, UNITED STATES DAUGHTERS OF 1812**

Saturday October 27, 2012 - Der Dutchman Restaurant, Bellville, Ohio

OPENING

The meeting was called to order by State President Susan Leininger at 9:35a.m.

Opening exercises were as follows:

Invocation by State Chaplain, Joan Stripe
The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America, the Salute to the Flag of 1812, and The American's Creed were recited in unison.

BUSINESS MEETING

Minutes – The minutes of the March 2012 State Council Meeting were approved as printed in the STAR & ANCHOR.

Financial Report – Treasurer Betty Graybill reported a checking account balance on 9/30/12 of \$10,963.67, income of \$5,472.71 and disbursements of \$4,666.85. The income figures include most of the chapters' dues. Total assets of the Ohio Society on 9/30/12 were \$20,618.59. All assets are in FirstMerit Bank. The report is attached to these minutes.

State Officer Reports

President – Susan Leininger reported on the June 18th Bicentennial events, Ringing the Bells for 1812 and raising the 15 star flags in Ohio counties. Ohio chapters have been busy with programs, library displays, and gravemarking ceremonies. The veteran grave index project has expanded to include an online index with photos.

First Vice President – Janet Rhodebeck reported on Morrow Co. Bicentennial event.

Second Vice President – Joyce Redder (absent)

Chaplain – Joan Stripe, no report

Recording Secretary – Sharon Keene-Smith (absent, report filed)

Corresponding Secretary – Gloria Fast (absent, report filed)

Registrar – Sharon Myers reported membership is 198, but that figure includes a number of members who have not yet paid their dues. There have been 17 new members since March, two reinstatements, three deaths and three resignations.

Historian – Margaret Bobo (absent, report filed)

Librarian – Debbie Hinton (absent)

Curator – Marilyn Vaglia (absent)

State Chairmen Reports

Correct Use of the Flag – Joan Stripe reported for Chairman Gloria Fast, who urged members to fly their flag at every opportunity and according to the Flag Code.

Flora Adams Darling Daughters – Sharon Meyers reported there are eight FADDs.

Junior Membership – Sharon Meyers reported there are currently nine Ohio Juniors.

Insignia – Carol Meyers reported Hamilton Jewelers have raised their prices on insignia as of Oct. 1 but she does not have a new price list yet. She said a number of members have ordered insignia this year.

Historical Landmarks; Grave Locations of 1812 Service Personnel; State President's Project – Sunda Peters was the overall coordinator for the "Ring the Bells for 1812" and flag raisings for all Ohio counties for the Ohio Bicentennial Commission. She also organized the Richland County ceremony. On October 13-14 volunteers from the Mansfield Blockhouse Completion Committee held a 200th Birthday Event at the blockhouse; Samuel Lewis chapter members assisted with this event. Sunda attended the grave marking of War of 1812 soldier, Samuel McClure, in a recently restored Richland Co. cemetery. Updating the veteran grave locations book is the State President's project; there are over 6,000 veterans listed and 800+ photos in the online database. There are 450 records and 475 photos waiting to be added. There are many more veterans to be researched and cemeteries to be photographed. There will be a cutoff date established for the printed book but the online database will probably be an ongoing project.

Micrographics – Melanie Hunt (absent, report filed)

National Defense – Nancy Wright reported she presented five JROTC medals in May. If your chapter would like to take part in this project you may contact her for information. Please remember to fly your flag and take part in veterans observances.

News-Letter, Star and Anchor, and Electronic Communications: Susan Leininger reported that about 50% of the membership receives the Star and Anchor electronically; this reduces the cost of mailing considerably. She has maintained the State Society's web site, updated the state membership interest brochure, and created a new publicity flyer which is a 1/3 page bookmark style containing key information taken from the membership brochure. It was designed to use at vendor/organization seminars or library interest days.

Printed Supplies – Betty Graybill brought a selection of free and sale items for the chapters. There is only one carton left of the Ohio Soldiers' Family Groups books.

Schools – Betty Cole asked chapters to keep the schools the National Society supports on the list when they make their donations.

Spirit of 1812 – Sharon Meyers reported a "Darling Husband" award was given to State President Leininger's husband, Eric, for all of his work on the veteran grave project's online database and also his cemetery research and

photography.

Chapter Reports

Commander William Wetmore Chapter – Sharon Myers reported they now have 35 members, 4 FADDs and 8 junior members. They have given their book of Veterans of the War of 1812 buried in Summit Co. to seven historical societies and libraries. They have been in two parades and conducted two ceremonies for veterans. They presented a Spirit of 1812 Award to a member who researched and photographed graves of 1812 soldiers in Portage Co. They presented a JROTC medal to a cadet at Garfield High School. They are going to participate in the After Hours Genealogy event at Akron/Summit Co. Public Library on Nov. 2. They have taken several road trips: one to Erie, PA where Commodore Perry built his fleet for the Battle of Lake Erie, and a trolley ride through Glendale Cemetery in Akron. They will be going to Ft. Meigs in June 2013.

General William Henry Harrison Chapter – Melanie Hunt was absent but her written report was read. The chapter has 23 members. They have met twice since State Council, in June at the home of Patsy Gaines where member Mary Sikora presented the program *Declaration of War of 1812*, and in September at Waldschmidt House where member Marjorie Smith presented a program on *Early American Textiles*. They presented two JROTC medals. Member Karen Klaene has been helping with the updating of grave locations of 1812 veterans.

Jacob Stemple Chapter – Gloria Fast reported they voted to print their collection of names and grave locations of veterans of the War of 1812 buried in the northwest counties of Ohio. Gladys Donson arranged to mark the graves of nine War of 1812 veterans. In October, a commemoration of the 200th Anniversary of the War of 1812 was held at Ft. Amanda. Members of other lineage societies also attended. They have 15 members and 6 prospective members.

Lucas Sullivant Chapter – Sharon Keene-Smith was absent but her written report stated that in September the chapter marked the graves of Real Granddaughters of Lucas Sullivant, Jane Sullivant Davison and Elizabeth Sullivant Underhill. Margaret Bobo and Sharon Copeland designed new Real Daughter and Granddaughter markers. They were approved for use by National and any chapter can use them for future grave markings.

Madison McKinley Chapter – Betty Graybill reported they are celebrating their 95th year. They have 14 members and one associate. They placed a rustic bench at Schoenbrun State Park; member Debbie Hinton represented the chapter

at the Stark Co. War of 1812 Ring the Bells program; and they have started photographing 1812 veteran graves. Their main projects are helping local veterans, the Canton VA Clinic, and overseas service personnel. They will be presenting a JROTC medal in Massillon.

Peter Navarre Chapter – Deborah Marisch reported they presented two JROTC medals, one at Middlefield HS to an AFROTC cadet and the other to a Sea Cadet aboard the USS Cod submarine. Members participated in the Bay Village Memorial Day parade as well as the Lorain Memorial Day ceremony. Bicentennial activities have included displays at Bay Village Library and Bay Village Historical Society’s Osborn Learning Center and a flag presentation to Cuyahoga County on the steps of the Court House. During Navy Week in Cleveland they participated in a Memorial Celebration at the Oliver Hazard Perry Monument in Fort Huntington Park. They presented a Spirit of 1812 award to Gerald Marisch for his daily emails to members of facts significant to the War of 1812.

Portage Trail/Commodore Perry Chapter – Carol Meyers reported members met briefly in May to reorganize the chapter after the death of Cem Macey. In August they met to elect new officers and collect dues.

Samuel Lewis Chapter – Janet Rhodebeck reported that members helped coordinate the state wide Ring the Bells for 1812 for Richland, Knox, and Morrow counties. Member Sunda Peters, with help from chapter members, planned the celebration of the 200th anniversary of the Mansfield Blockhouse in Oct. They marked the grave of War of 1812 veteran Samuel McClure in September. They have made potholders as a fundraiser for OGS and the chapter.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

The donation of \$500 to the State of Ohio War of 1812 Bicentennial Commission's Flag Project was not needed to fund the purchase of the flags. Prior to writing our check, it was learned that a corporate sponsor had been found to donate the entire amount needed. Discussion was held on several alternate projects for the reserved funds, including the Federation of Genealogical Societies' "Preserve the Pensions" War of 1812 pension file digitization project. This is a project that will benefit the general public. Betty Cole moved to redirect the \$500 donation to help with the FGS digitization of pension records of War of 1812 veterans. Motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS

Treasurer Betty Graybill presented the proposed budget for the coming year. Joan Stripe moved we accept the budget as presented. Motion passed.

President Leininger gave some updates from the National Board Meeting. National has a pin available for a \$40 donation to the Electronic Imaging Fund. (She has several with her). National is digitizing all U.S.D.1812 applications and these donations help support that effort. There are plans for Insignia purchase to be available online through Hamilton Jewelers.

Meigs on June 13, of which all of the Ohio Society is invited to attend.

JACOB STEMPLER CHAPTER

This chapter reports a variety of activities in 2012. One meeting was spent at Lima's Allen County Museum genealogy room researching ancestors and veterans. Another meeting, Gladys Donson gave an account of the life of Blue Jacket, correcting the error that he had been a white boy captured by the Indians.

Chapter members have gathered names and cemetery locations of veterans of War of 1812 in northwest Ohio. Member donations covered the expenses for printing the books, and, at present, ten books have been placed in area libraries.

In April, we toured Fort Amanda in preparation for the October Muster. At the Muster, the 1812 Flag was raised for the day of reenactments and walking tours, and guides explained the history of the fort and area.

Gladys Donson, Kathy Foust, Carla Smith and Joan Stripe participated in the "Ring the Bells for 1812" event, raising the 1812 flag and ringing bells in different counties.

State President Susan Leininger and her husband, Eric, joined us for Grave Markings in Defiance County Cemeteries. Gladys Donson planned the day's tributes to nine veterans of the War of 1812. These men had tombstones but were not previously known 1812 veterans and did not have a flag or flag holder at their gravesites. This event was held September 15, 2012, at two cemeteries. Daughters and Sons of War of 1812, DAR, SAR, local dignitaries, descendants of the veterans, and area residents attended on the beautiful fall day. The Farmer American Legion were present with the American Flag. Chapter members attended in period costumes and two husbands, dressed in hunter dress of 1812, carried the 1812 Flag and Jacob Stemple Chapter Flag.

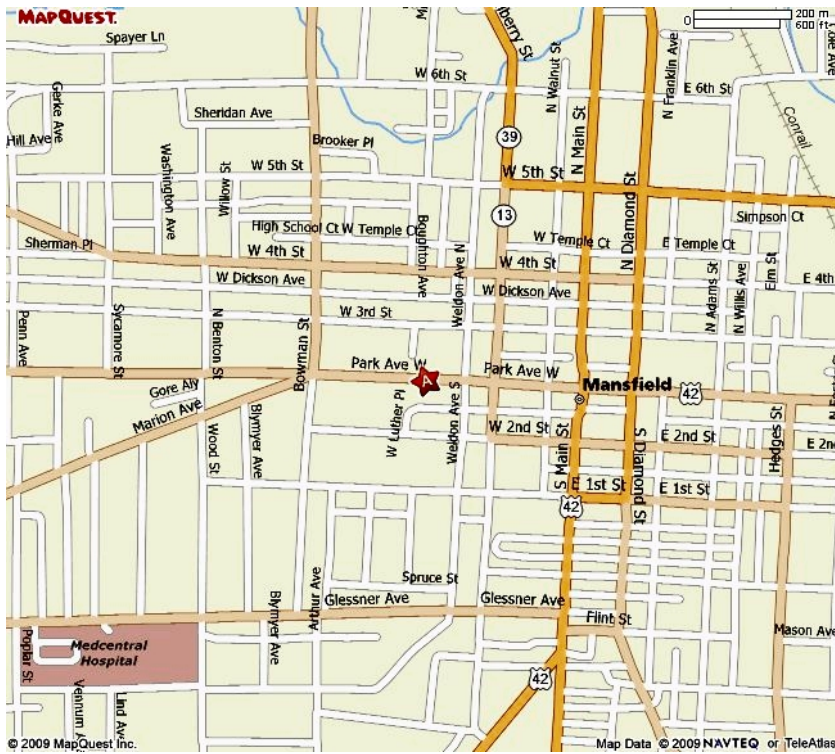
Now if this isn't enough, Chapter President Sharon Myers has asked the Director, Mr. Rick Finch, to do something special for us. He will lead us on a short driving tour to see some little-visited areas related to the battles of Fort Meigs - **INCLUDING** the last remnants of a British artillery position and Fort Miamis, the main British camp during the First Siege of Fort Meigs. These areas are off-site from the Fort and are something that you would not see just by visiting the Fort on your own.

If we enter the Fort in a group of more than 10, we receive \$1 off the regular admission cost of \$8 for adults, \$7 for seniors. OHS members are admitted free. The tour of the Fort will begin at 10:15 a.m. sharp on June 13th, as we have a lot to see! We will then go into town for lunch at a quaint restaurant, and then go on the off-site trip conducted by Mr. Finch.

2013 is the Bicentennial of the first and second Sieges of Ft. Meigs, so this is a very timely excursion for us!

From I-71 South, take exit 176 (Rt. 30 West); from Rt. 30 take the Main St./Norwalk exit and turn left onto Main St. At the top of the hill turn right onto Park Ave. The hotel is 3 blocks down on right hand side.

From I-71 North, take exit 169 (Rt. 13 North); turn left onto Rt. 13. Continue on Rt. 13 for 4.5 miles. Turn right on 1st St.; then left on Diamond St.; then left on Park Ave. The hotel is 3 blocks down on the right hand side.
