My Dear Friends,

This message today comes as suggestion from someone I love dearly. In fact, I've loved her everyday of her life. She is my oldest daughter, Gretchen. She said over dinner the other day, "Dad, I have an idea for your next newsletter article. You asked for an organ, and you got that. You asked for money for Travis' tuition, and you got that. You need to ask for Sunday School teachers for the children."



I had to admit that I didn't really know too much about that need. After all, I'm busy with the worship services on Sunday morning, and I don't have first hand contact with the children in Sunday School. And, to be honest about it, Nancy hadn't rung the alarm bell to get my attention on this subject. So, I explained this to my daughter.

She said, "Dad, everybody loves working for Nancy. She never gets ruffled and always has the attitude that everything will work out, but we really need some people to step up and volunteer to teach the children." I believe Gretchen knows what she is talking about, because she is, obviously, very smart, and she and her husband, Jeff, teach in the children's ministry.

I don't think a congregation as great as Mt. Auburn should have to beg for Sunday School teachers. There are so many things we do extremely well. It's time we added our children's ministry to this list. I was pleased that all the teachers for VBS volunteered very quickly. That will be a great week. But, we need a sustained effort from many more people every Sunday if we are to have a program of excellence.

I'm looking forward to some really big advances in our children's ministry. I fully believe this should be the next growth area in our church program. Mt. Auburn can have the kind of ministry that attracts and motivates children, and sets their hearts on fire for God. But, it all has to start with the basics. We need people whose hearts are on fire for God and who love children to give themselves — heart, mind and soul — to this ministry.

Now, if you don't love children – don't call. We don't want you in this ministry. Maybe you can trim bushes, plant flowers, or set up and take down chairs. But, if you have a love for God and children – call Nancy today and tell her you are signing up to work with children. It may be the most significant step you will ever take for God and His Kingdom. What will be greater on that great day – when we stand at the Judgment Seat of Christ – than knowing you had a hand in some young hearts first being introduced and coming to know the love of God? — Jim Hertel

# A Prayer Shawl for You.


This lapghan was made especially for Don Jones. At the outset of this creation, Lapghan, the knitter prayed for God to bless the knitter's mind, hands, soul, yarn, needles and knitting to create a blessing from him. While knitting, the knitter constantly prayed for Don holding him in thoughts of quiet reflection and asking the Lord to make this gift a blessing for him. The colors of the yarn selected have significant attributes associated with them. The **Red** is for energy, courage, and power. The **Green** is for healing and hope. The **Black** is to absorb any negativity and **White** for faith. The stitch pattern incorporates the "threes" representing the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost.

At the completion of the lapghan, another blessing was asked that God's grace could be upon this warming, comforting, enfolding, and embracing the receiver. May this mantle be a safe Haven...a sacred place of security and well being...sustaining and embracing in good times as well as difficult ones, May you, Don receive this lapghan and be cradled in hope, kept in joy and health, graced with peace, and wrapped in God's love. ### **Handmade Ugandan Necklaces Still for Sale**

Thanks to those at Mt. Auburn , the Maryland Community Church (where my daughter Anna Lovell's family attends), and my hairstylist Savannah White (who let me set up a display in her shop!) I have been able to wire \$300 to Betty Balonde at Trinity United Methodist Church in Jinja, Uganda. That represents about 30 necklaces but is an amount of money that is of enormous help to the women (mostly widows) of the church who hope to use the sale of these necklaces in the USA to supplement their meager incomes from selling the excess produce from their gardens. The average income of a family in Uganda is \$80 per year. A child can go to school (no public education exists) for around \$10/month which is not a lot for us but is a burden on a widow with an average of 6 children in the family.

I have left a display with necklaces in Jim's office, but I have several hundred necklaces still available and as you can see from the following Email from Betty that I received, they are eagerly working on more and will be sending them to me via American visitors. I am pursuing other possible avenues to find markets for these and appreciate any suggestions or assistance in this endeavor. It is a mission opportunity with a tremendous impact. Read below and see how appreciative they are!


