

The Book of Wisdom and all of the four Gospels contain messages of hope and comfort. The author of Wisdom is writing for the Jews living in Alexandria, Egypt about fifty years before the birth of Jesus. The Jews were becoming too Hellenistic in their beliefs and life style, and the author aims to get them back to their cultural roots of the Old Testament, which relied on God's teachings of justice and right-eousness.

The spiritual thought at this time involved the concept of God's retribution for sin by bestowing adversities on the sinner. Sin resulted from a failure to follow the will of God. The Book of Wisdom shows that death and sin have no power; for all power comes from God only. If adversities do occur to man, they are forms of purification and opportunities to show fidelity to God's will.

In these five verses of today's reading, the author explains that death and sin come from the envy of the devil. The devil envies God's gifts to Adam. These gifts were (1) being created in the image of God and (2) receiving control of all of God's creation. Whatever the cause, it is the devil who brings Adam to sin and that sin destroyed man's relationship with God. A return to the old ways to justice and righteousness would restore a place with God.

Mark's Gospel shows the power of God through Jesus' teachings and miracles. In the cases of the miracles in today's passage the people show faith; and faith in God's teachings is what the author of Wisdom wants the Jews to return to. His words are meant to offer hope and comfort in their situation in Alexandria. As long as the people are with God, God is with them. This is also Jesus' message to seek the Kingdom of God.

The main connection between these two readings for this Sunday is an afterlife with God. The Book of Wisdom is the first Book of the Bible to suggest an afterlife with God. Jesus' preaching, through word and deed, gives us hope of an afterlife with God if we too follow a path of justice and righteousness.

Finding Jesus in the Crowd

Multi-tasking can be a difficult thing to do for many of us. Some of us are very talented at the task, others, fail miserably. In today's gospel reading (Mark 5: 21-40) Jesus seems to be showing us how to multi-task but in reality, He is teaching us several lessons: the power of faith, the importance of dwelling in the moment, and staying focused on God.

While surrounded by a large crowd, Jesus is approached by Jairus, a synagogue official, whose daughter was dying. One would think Jesus would pay attention to the official because of his high standing in society, but in reality, Jesus was moved by the plea of a worried parent. As Jesus is escorted through the large crowd, which is pressing in on Him from every side, a woman afflicted with hemorrhages reaches out and touches the hem of his garment. Instantly, Jesus recognizes the power of a healing touch moving through him and into this woman. Jesus demands to know who touched him.

Have you ever been in the midst of a large crowd with people bumping into you on every side? It only makes sense that people would be touching you. So, why does Jesus appear to be upset when someone touches such a small bit of his clothing like his hem? What does he expect? Look at the hem of your clothing, gently touch it. Can you sense the light touch? Imagine being in a large crowd. Do you think you would sense someone touching the hem of your clothing? Are you that attentive to one person while in the midst of a large crowd? But it wasn't just the touch that Jesus felt, He felt healing power going out of him. The woman's faith caused the healing and shows us the power of possessing a great faith.

Jesus was multi-tasking that day but also stayed in the present moment, open to anything or anyone who would need his loving attention. As we go throughout each day we are often bombarded with events and people who demand our attention. It can be very hard to divide ourselves and often when we do something or someone suffers. The key to getting through times like these is to focus the eyes of our hearts on God and trust that HE will give us all we need to get everything done.

One thing about a crowd, it can be defined as a lot of people asking a lot of things from us. But a crowd is also anything which divides our heart and prevents us from staying focused on Jesus, including our egos. When Jesus finds himself in our hearts but crowded in the midst of our own agendas, need for power, prestige, or attention, it is difficult for us to reach out and find Him. The woman with hemorrhages was also crowded but knew which garment belonged to Jesus. It could be nothing other than her free and open heart which reached out for Love in great faith.

May we clear our hearts of all which crowds out Jesus so we can find Him and realize the power of faith in our lives.



Bishop Malesic's residence

Bishop-elect Edward C. Malesic will live in the rectory at St. Paul Parish, Greensburg, after his ordination and installation as Bishop of Greensburg.

Bishop-elect Malesic had a variety of residency options available to him in the Diocese. He made the decision after considering the options presented to him and after consultation with Father Lawrence L. Manchas, pastor of St. Paul Parish, and the parish's pastoral and finance councils. Father Manchas lives in the rectory at St. Bruno Parish.

The rectory will remain the property of St. Paul Parish. The Diocese will enter into a lease agreement with the parish for use of the rectory for the time Bishop-elect Malesic lives there.

Bishop-elect Malesic, after his ordination and installation, will form a committee to study potential uses of the current bishop's residence that the diocese owns in Maplewood Terrace, Hempfield Township. Because the residence is a diocesan asset, the bishop must consult with diocesan advisers before making a decision concerning its future.
