Intensive Intervention Summer School (IISS) is designed to give students the opportunity to recover credits in courses they have already failed. Students are placed into summer school courses based upon what courses they need to graduate and the grades they earned. **Priority is given first to students currently enrolled in SMMUSD.** Priority is then given to students according to their grade level, with rising seniors having the highest priority. As spaces become available, we will accommodate students who need to repeat a class to raise their grade. There are no guarantees of course offerings or enrollment.

IMPORTANT DATES and TIMES

- Summer school runs Monday – Friday and begins on Monday, June 17, 2013 and runs through Friday, July 19, 2013.
- Classes will run from 8:00 am and ends at 12:30 pm each day with Period 1: 8:00 - 10:05, and Period 2: 10:25 - 12:30.
- Students cannot begin summer school after the 3rd day, Thursday, June 19, 2013.
- There is NO SCHOOL on Thursday, July 4, 2013 in observance of the Independence Day holiday.
- *Notifications of acceptance into the program will be sent home after the first 2 days of summer school if space is available.*

Attendance for all days of summer school is mandatory. Students, who miss more than 3 days, will not earn credits. As such, the summer school principal will drop a student after the 3rd absence. We will make every opportunity to call parents when student's absences are affecting his/her ability to remain in summer school. We will contact parents when a student is dropped. Students who do not show for the first day of IISS may lose their spot, if they have not contacted the Summer School Principal previously. Due to budget considerations and credit hours, there are no acceptable absences during summer school. If a student is tardy 4 times, he/she will have earned the equivalent of 1 day of absence which will be applied to the overall absences of the student and contribute to the possibility of being dropped from summer school. Our rules during summer school are the same rules that we follow during the school year. Negative consequences for negative choices can include being dropped from summer school.

I agree to all conditions regarding summer school enrollment. Failure to adhere to conditions set forth in the above agreement may result in a loss of credit and removal from summer school.
