Your Application Essay should be between 750-1,000 words (please type and double-space) and should have three parts (Parts A, B and C):

Part A: Academic History

- Please comment on your high school record (and/or college/university, if applicable) and any reasons you think your previous academic record may not reflect your potential.
- What, if any, challenges did you face in high school (and/or college/university, if applicable), for example: academic, personal, disability, etc.? How did you address them?
- How you plan to ensure you successfully address challenges encountered while at university?

Part B: Academic Goals

- Why do you wish to attend university, what do you want to study and why?
- What are your alternate plans if not accepted to ESP/AESP?

Part C: Why ESP/AESP is right for me

- (Be sure to read up on our program on our website in order to help you address this section.)

 How can the program help you achieve your goals? Please be specific about what aspects of the program you feel will be helpful to you and why.
 - The Seminars and Workshops both call for working with other students, often in groups. Have you had problems with group work in the past, how will you address these problems in the future?

Please provide your referees with a copy of these guidelines. When you receive your reference letters from your references, do not open the envelope. Submit the sealed envelopes with your application package.

To the Referee:

Please write a letter at least one page in length, using the guidelines below. The completed letter should be returned to the student in a sealed envelope, with your signature across the seal. Or you may mail your letter directly to the ESP/AESP at the address below.

All letters will be kept confidential.

Guidelines for Letter:

Please identify the applicant, the capacity in which you came to know them, and the length of your acquaintance. Include an assessment of the applicant's personal qualifications and suitability for university study.

Any information you can provide on the following areas would be helpful:

- communication skills (written and/or oral)
- willingness to take initiative
- level of motivation
- planning and organizational skills
- flexibility and adaptability
- willingness to accept responsibility
- leadership, analytical, problem-solving ability
- interpersonal skills, group interaction and team-working skills.

Please provide examples of the qualities you describe.

What are the applicant's strengths and weaknesses? Have they made efforts to address areas of concern?
