Is Missing Sunday Mass Wrong?

If I miss Mass on a Sunday through my own fault, am I committing? a sin? I used to think it was a mortal sin to miss Mass willingly on Sunday. Now I see that many of my good Catholic friends miss every once in a while and don't seem to think much of it. When I asked them if they thought it was a sin to miss Mass, they said no. Who is right? This really bothers me.

Dear M.P.H.,

The Church teaches that we have a serious obligation to attend Sunday Mass. This obligation can only be set aside or a serious reason, such as illness, condition associated with aging, or being physically unable to get to church. No, it's not a sin to miss Mass if it happens for one of these reasons; however, missing Mass is sinful if you miss regularly and willingly, because regularly skipping Mass shows contempt for an important law of the Church.

When we attend Mass, we're not simply being present to an action taking place within a church. Rather, we are worshipping God and acknowledging our dependence on God. Sunday Mass is also a splendid opportunity to thank God for past favors and ask for future graces.

A number of people have told me that they can pray to God anywhere (such as on a golf course), and that they don't have to attend Mass to pray. This, of course, is true. But it misses the point.

Christ established the Eucharistic celebration as a special way for us to express our love and adoration for him. Even more importantly, God has things to say to us in Mass that we will not hear outside of Mass. At Mass, we hear the voice of God in a very personal and direct way in the prayers themselves, in the readings from the Sacred Scripture, and in the homily. If anyone is intentionally absent, these holy messages of inspirations and support will not be heard.

The voice of Church is a voice of God. When the Church spoke in the Second Vatican Council it said the Mass provides "a supper of brotherly fellowship and a foretaste of the heavenly banquet" (Pastoral Constitution on the Church on the Modern World, 38). That's why Mass should be the focus of the whole life of the Christian community.

The Mass is so fantastically important in the lives of Catholics because it presents an opportunity to receive the Body and the Blood of our Savior in a holy and reverential setting. There is nothing in this world that can equal the Eucharist. It is the rock and foundation of strength for living and coping with life. It is love exemplified in a most perfect manner-through Jesus' union with us. The Eucharist provides a series of doors to sacred truth and the mysterious reality of God.

Many people think that missing Sunday Mass is not a sin, and others think it's a waste of time. I have often asked people like this what they would put in place of Mass. That's because I believe we must do something to acknowledge the life and love of that God gives us.

Yes, some Catholics are making up their own minds about what is sin and what is not. That can be good at times, but when it involves attendance at Sunday Mass, no one can err by following the Church's teaching.
