Debbie is a teacher at Driftwood Middle School in Hollywood and has dedicated several years of gardening for the Atalas earning awards of great distinction. These butterflies are procreating so much there, that Peggy and others have rescued hundreds of caterpillars to relocate in other gardens.

We have been wanting to assist in the formation of a Friends of Long Key Nature Center for quite a while. The Broward County Parks and Recreation Division's Community Partnership and Outreach Program staff joined us at an organizational meeting yesterday and we are off to a great start. The

group would need to incorporate as a non-profit corporation in the State of Florida and also file for a 501 (c) (3) status with the IRS. As soon as the date is decided, it will be announced.

12th Annual Water Matters Day will be held on Saturday, March 8, 2014. Please mark your calendars for this wonderful event, volunteer for a two or three hour shift, and receive two free plants/trees. We really need more people to handle the crowds that surround our booths.

David will have some 'new' herbs, a great caladium, a medicinal plant from South America, 3 ferns and a wild pineapple. He found a source for Worm Castings produced in Naples. Bring a zip-lock bag for a sample after he discusses this mycorrhizal inoculant and how it could help your gardening and potting. David also announced that onNovember 16th at Jim Ward Park - some really good people are presenting.

BUSH is meeting next Friday, November 8th at Trinity Lutheran Church 11 SW 11th Street, Fort Lauderdale. Dr. Kimberly Moore will be covering organics in the landscape. Bring your questions in a plastic bag.
