- To have your personal information kept confidential.
- To be kept informed of volunteer Buddy social activities organized by the ELP Buddy Program.

Approved UofG ELP Buddy Volunteers have the following <u>responsibilities:</u>

- To attend a mandatory training session prior to being matched.
- To complete a minimum of one term as an ELP Buddy Volunteer.
- To respond to emails and/or phone calls from the ELP Buddy Coordinator within 3 days.
- To respect the privacy and confidentiality of your ELP Buddy.
- To complete an evaluation at the end of each term that you are an ELP Buddy Volunteer.

Approved UofG ELP Buddy Volunteers have the following expectations:

- To understand and support the goals of the ELP Buddy Program.
- To attend and encourage your ELP Buddy to attend ELP Buddy events.
- To refer your ELP Buddy to appropriate ELP Services and support staff as necessary.
- To attend the Buddy Kick-off event in September or January.
- To meet your ELP Buddy once a week during the first month you are matched, and at least once a month until the end of the term
- To stay in touch with your ELP Buddy by phone or email at least once a week.
