Higher Opportunities for Women

Ten women graduated from the Spring 2012 HOW session this June and are on their way to an exciting new career! Why not join them? Higher Opportunities for Women (HOW) is an intensive 16-week pre-employment training program that helps prepare participants for entry-level office positions. The course offers 80 hours of professional computer training, 40 hours of job search preparation, and 120 hours of on-the-job training working at an unpaid externship in the community. Fiber Optics Network Cabling

Calling expectant and new parents! Professional social workers come to your home to provide counseling and instruction, answer questions, and offer support. Maternal and child health, child development, child care, discipline, life skills, home management skills, and more are covered. **Participation in this program can count toward Work First New Jersey required activities.**

Additional Services for Parents & Families —

Taking action to prevent child sexual abuse in Sussex and Warren Counties.

Project Self-Sufficiency is proud to launch the **Enough Abuse Campaign** in collaboration with Prevent Child Abuse NJ and the Sussex Warren Partnership to Prevent Child Sexual Abuse. The goal of the Enough Abuse Campaign is to end child sexual abuse by educating and empowering community members to recognize and respond to the warning signs of abuse and to end the silence and shame that surrounds it.

Community-Wide Education & Awareness

Certified trainers will provide FREE Enough Abuse Campaign trainings to mobilize adults and communities to prevent child sexual abuse using the core campaign curriculum.

The "It's Not Just Jenna" child sexual abuse prevention training is designed to educate middle and high school youth, their parents, and other youth-serving professionals on how to recognize and prevent child sexual abuse. Through this training you will learn:

- Behavior signs to be aware of in adults that might indicate they pose a risk to children or teens;
- Ways sexual abusers "groom" or establish trust with potential victims and their families;
- 3. Behavior signs to look for in children or teens that may indicate they are being or have been sexually abused;
- 4. Reasons it is difficult for victims of child sexual abuse to tell;
- 5. How to respond if we see behavior signs in adults that indicate they might pose a risk to children and teens; and
- 6. How to respond to behavior signs in a child/teen which raise concerns they may have been or are being sexually abused.

The 18-minute "It's Not Just Jenna" video presentation is followed by a facilitated discussion of what Jenna's story teaches us about child sexual abuse and how to prevent it.

Employment Lab

Exclusively for active PSS participants, the PSS Employment Lab offers assistance for those who wish to work on their careers, whether looking for a job, upgrading skills to maintain your current job or secure a promotion, or even just determining which career is right for you so that you can outline your next steps to get there.

Work Readiness Credential Testing

The Work Readiness Credential is a national job readiness credential which shows potential employers that you possess core standard competencies for employment in an entry level position. Assessment covers 5 areas— Employability Skills, Communication Skills, Interpersonal Skills, Decision-Making Skills, and Lifelong Learning Skills. If you score well, you will be awarded a Work Readiness Credential certificate that is recognized by employers throughout the US. Advance registration is required to take the test. There is a fee to take the test; the fee is waived for Project Self-Sufficiency participants.

WorkFirst New Jersey

New for Fall 2012, Project Self-Sufficiency has designated a WorkFirst Center on its Newton Campus to be used specifically for WorkFirst NJ training activities.

Job Readiness/Job Search Group

This 4-week group, which will be held in the WorkFirst Center at Project Self-Sufficiency's Newton Campus, is open exclusively to WorkFirst New Jersey recipients who are referred by the Division of Social Services or the Department of Labor and Workforce Development. This is a structured employability skills program which fulfills the training requirement for *Work First New Jersey* participants. Job Readiness/Job Search Group includes computer training, career assessments, and extensive hands-on practice with job search techniques.

Four separate groups will run continuously year-round—

GROUP A: Begins on the 1st Monday of every month **GROUP B:** Begins on the 3rd Monday of every month **GROUP C:** Begins on the 1st Monday of every month **GROUP D:** Begins on the 3rd Monday of every month

All run Monday through Friday, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Community Work Experience Program (CWEP)

Eligible WFNJ recipients will work with a Project Self-Sufficiency Career Counselor to be placed in an unpaid externship with a local community employer. The purpose of CWEP is to provide real world work experience that will not only help the individual develop new skills but become comfortable and confident working in a professional setting.

CWEP (Community Work Experience Program) takes place Monday through Friday, 9:00 a.m.—4:00 p.m.

Made possible by the generosity of the IOLTA Fund of the Bar of NJ, the IOLTA Legal Assistance Program is designed to provide legal education and assistance to those who typically could not afford it.

With the exception of Legal Forums, which are open to the general public, the services of the IOLTA Program are available only to those who meet income and other guidelines. Both PSS participants and members of the public must meet these criteria to receive services. To determine eligibility, call (973) 940-3500.

IOLTA Legal Forums

Forums are two-hour informational sessions conducted by a volunteer attorney, free of charge and open to the public regardless of income. You must register in advance by calling (973) 940-3500.

Individual Consultations

Open to members of the general public who meet income guidelines. Eligible individuals may receive a 45-minute consultation with a volunteer attorney who will not provide legal representation, but will answer questions, review legal paperwork, and offer general advice. Consultations are restricted to non-criminal matters.

Pro-Se Divorce Workshops

Income-eligible individuals may participate in attorney-led workshops which will walk them through the process of completing and filing divorce paperwork pro se (or do-it-yourself). These workshops are for those whose divorces do not involve property, support, or custody disputes. The attorney will not provide representation. Workshops run only with sufficient registration.

Do-It-Yourself Legal Clinics

Income-eligible individuals may receive help preparing and filing family law motions such as child support, visitation, and custody. Also underway is a new DIY Legal Clinic on Expungement. Clinics are run by volunteer attorneys, but do not offer representation. Clinics run only with sufficient registration.

Court Accompaniment/Pro Bono Representation

Only active Project Self-Sufficiency participants are eligible for these services. A 3-step screening process is required for Pro Bono Representation, and those accepted into the program must donate community service hours in the nonprofit sector.


