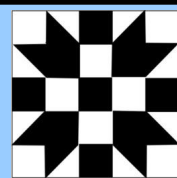

We did it, again, another great show.

I must share an email I received from someone who visited our show on Friday: “We came to the show, were awed by the amazing quilts at your show, and congratulate you on the many quilts with master techniques.” I also spoke with attendees who also were amazed with our quilts and the wonderful vendors. Some are planning on joining our guild after visiting our show.

I am writing this from California, where I am visiting my newest granddaughter. She arrived early, March 1st. This is typical for my family, if it is a quilt show year, we will have new babies or weddings. The big sister is enjoying her presents I bought at the guild boutique, loves the shoulder bag and the scrappy snake.

I would like to express my appreciation to everyone who helped with our 14th biennial quilt show. Each of the committee chairs put together great teams and with the support of our guild volunteers the pieces came together. The planning and preparations for our show seems to go by quickly.

My **Co-Chair and silent partner, Linda Blasen**, has so much experience in judging and contract knowledge. Susan Ott, who handled the search for a show judge, so important to a guild like ours, with a diversified group of talented quilters and fiber artists.

Admissions were in the hands of **Carol Brown and Carroll Jenkins**. These ladies know how to handle our rush on Fridays and get the bus groups in with precision.

Award Ribbons: Bette Behana, who brought together our lovely show logo and ribbons, which looked fantastic. So exciting to see these on the quilts and I am sure our winners loved the added detail of the year on their ribbons.

Bankers: Joy Abbott and Helen Lucas, these ladies did quite a bit of prep for our show and this makes things run so smoothly. We added the Square credit card system this year. This added new details and additional hours of preparation; however we did see a significant increase in sales as a result of this option in our guild booths.

Block Auction: what a trio of energy: **Bette Behana, Marylee Charlett and Cathy Lane**. They challenged us to bring more blocks and we did, 39 sets. We even had a special set of blocks from Gwen Marston. They have raised the bar for future shows.

Boutique: another trio of energy and creative minds: **Cass Bowen, Linda Pearce and Janine Ward**. They put together an amazing assortment of original designs and made these items from some very exceptional materials. Their workshops were so fun, creative and a real social gathering for our guild. I will never throw out another scrap or UFO.

Challenge: Karla Lynch with assistant **Mary Nissen**. Wonderful response to the challenge, which added to our show with the original designs. Mary even made the ribbons, which used the challenge fabric.

Consignments: Janet Wick once again volunteered. She brought together a lovely display of a wide assortment of items from our members. She assembled a group of great helpers who assisted with sales.

Donor Quilt: Mary Lewis. This quilt was so perfect for our show, a beautiful blend of batik fabrics with a touch of tradition with the appliqué border. Mary designed this in EQ7 and assembled individual packets of star blocks for members to stitch and return for her to assemble. Members who enjoy this process handled the appliqué. The fabrics were purchased from two local quilt shops, Alma Sue's and Cotton Patch. Guild member Lynn Yates did the machine quilting.

Donor Quilt Tickets: Elva Farrell. There was a different approach for this show's donor quilt. Elva took on the job and with her attention to detail and great organization skills she oversaw a somewhat challenging schedule of market days, guild meetings, and shop displays. Thanks to her great data we can see how important these changes were to both donor quilt ticket sales and promoting our quilt show.

Door Prize: Sue Balazs. What a great assortment of items Sue gathered from members, vendors and quilt related companies. In fact many attendees who brought their husbands (who did pay to enter show) made sure he picked up a program for a chance to win a door prize. We have quite a good reputation of good things at a great quilt show.

Program: Mary Lewis. This was one of the little bumps in the road, I mentioned. Mary stepped into this role when a member moved just a bit earlier than expected. She brought the program to the printer in a very timely manner. Mary is very, very good with design in programs, quilts and feathers.

Judging: Linda Blasen. This was so wonderfully organized and so appreciated by our show judge and those who volunteer. Charlotte Hase has made this process so smooth for many years by providing her home for both drop off and judging.

Publicity: Dawn Moore. This show certainly continued our trend upward in attendance. Dawn coordinated with Elva with our donor quilt and helped to move it around in the south county guilds and shops. She also made some new connections for us on the web to publicize our show.

Registration and Quilt Arrangement: Tena Davis. So much is done behind the scenes with this area. With assistants, Anna A. Vaughn and Susan Arndt, quilts are registered and assigned to proper categories. The team also determines the overall hanging/arranging of the quilts for the show. This is a somewhat fluid design process as final layout is determined by judging. Anna and Susan were in on the process this year; maybe they will be handling this important role in a coming show.

Quilt Drop-off: Susan Arndt. She brought together a lovely mixed bag of volunteers. A few new ones mixed in with a strong group of experienced volunteers. It was well organized and we got through a bumper crop of quilts before lunch.

Quilt Rack Set-up: Elva Farrell and son-in-law. Yes, she convinced her son-in-law to help; now that is quite a feat. She had notebooks with hanging and pinning assignments ready for team leaders. With volunteers and plenty of ladders, mallets, and a few drills the process began. It took a bit longer with about twice as many king quilts and other large quilts to position during the setup process for this show, but Elva kept the rows in order and everyone was in awe at the quilt display this year.

Quilt Rack Takedown: Barb Johnson. She was in on the setup so she could be ready for the takedown. Barb brought along her husband and along with a great group of volunteers the show was down, sheets folded, quilts arranged for pickup. This process is so fast compared to setup; however she was so wise to be in on both.

Quilt Rack Transport: Joy Abbott. Joy's husband and a helper handled this. They picked up racks the evening before and met the setup crews at 8am. They returned on takedown and returned everything neatly to our storage unit. Our guild is so very grateful for their support and muscles.

Rules/Categories: Susan Ott and Quilt Show Chairs review this. This process starts for each show as the previous show ends. Susan has helped with this process for a number of shows, you can see the evidence as we are considered among the best in guild shows on the west coast of Florida, from our peers and show judges.

Sheets: Beth Grindal. Whew and I thought I had laundry. Beth volunteered once again for this important job. She carefully reviews our sheets and makes sure they are clean and in good condition prior to our judging and show dates. On setup day she has a group of ironing ladies who do lots of pressing work. We had over 70 sheets in this year's show.

Show Hostesses & Information. We did not have 'white glove' for all hours of our show, however everyone followed through by wearing his or her nametags. Dawn Moore was at the information table each day and our admissions ladies greeted each person with a plastic glove. Great job by everyone.

Signage on Quilts: Jann Nohe. The quilt signage is a bit of a process, first get all the descriptions to fit in the space and then get them pinned along side of the quilts. Not too hard, but lots of careful pinning. Then she accepted the job of pinning the ribbons too. Glad she had a helper in Cass Bowen.

Small Quilt Auction: Savvy Saturday Sisters. Another great job of displaying over 100 small quilts over the two days. Looks like they met their goals for this show. We had one small piece go for \$100. Thanks to all who donated or purchased small quilts.

Sewing Machine Raffle: Emily Gross. Emily was all prepared to handle this raffle along with Elva on show days, when a surprise interrupted her plans. She was certainly missed on show days. Elva stopped in and picked up the machine donated by Quilters' Haven & More. Ticket sales were higher at this year's show.

Vendors: Sharon Taylor. Great group of vendors this year. Sharon was there each day making sure our vendors' needs were met. So many people were heard saying this was the best group of vendors. I am sure we will have a lengthy waiting list for our show in 2015, thanks to Sharon's oversight of this and past shows.

Viewer's Choice Ballots: Cass Bowen. Now I know some of you have noticed some names pop up in a number of roles in our show. Well, Cass, who just happens to be our guild president, seems to be able to multitask with ease. I think we need to find out what type of cereal she eats for breakfast. Cass oversaw this task and had the ballots ready to reveal the viewer's choice prior to close of show.

As I said at the meeting, thank you for allowing me the opportunity to be a part of this wonderful guild. It is so very nice to have the programs our show helps us provide throughout the years. I am ready to do a little work on improving my skills at feathers, that is just one of the areas that this year's show has inspired me.
