

Dear brothers and sisters,

As many of you know, Father Gabino is being transferred to St. Stephen Parish in Framingham at the end of August. I am grateful for his presence at Saint Mary's over the past five years. This will mean added responsibilities for me to minister in a multi-lingual community. I will have to find time (I don't know how) to improve my Spanish speaking skills. I will also be relying on the assistance of Fr. David Martin Ssentamu. Fr. David just completed a two-year assignment as chaplain at Lahey Clinic. It was an intense period of ministering to the sick, dying, doctors, nurses and staff as well as to families of those connected with patients. That assignment required him to make multiple visits to Lahey throughout the night and early morning. Fr. David has just returned from visiting his family in Uganda and will now begin serving as a part-time parochial vicar at Saint Mary's and part-time parochial vicar at Saint Charles. His salary will be shared by the two parishes. Obviously, Father David is well known around here and he is familiar with the routine. Please pray that his ministry this years brings glory - Father Michael to God.

NEW COMMUNION MINISTERS/LECTORS

One of the things we have been trying to do is train new communion ministers and lectors. Some parishioners have been asked and others have volunteered but there has been a delay in scheduling the training sessions. We plan to have them in August so people can start serving in the Fall. You don't have to be perfect. You need to be a baptized, confirmed Catholic who regularly attends Mass and receives Communion and believes that the Holy Scripture is the Word of God and that the Eucharist is truly Jesus' Body and Blood.

ACTS OF THE APOSTLES - CHAPTER 4, PART 2

Prayer of the Community.

After their release they went back to their own people and reported what the chief priests and elders had told them. And when they heard it, they raised their voices to God with one accord and said, "Sovereign Lord, maker of heaven and earth and the sea and all that is in them, you said by the holy Spirit through the mouth of our father David, your servant:

'Why did the Gentiles rage and the peoples entertain folly? The kings of the earth took their stand and the princes gathered together against the Lord and against his anointed.'

Indeed they gathered in this city against your holy servant Jesus whom you anointed, Herod and Pontius Pilate, together with the Gentiles and the peoples of Israel, to do what your hand and [your] will had long ago planned to take place. And now, Lord, take note of their threats, and enable your servants to speak your word with all boldness, as you stretch forth [your] hand to heal, and signs and wonders are done through the name of your holy servant Jesus." As they prayed, the place where they were gathered shook, and they were all filled with the holy Spirit and continued to speak the word of God with boldness.

Life in the Christian Community.

The community of believers was of one heart and mind, and no one claimed that any of his possessions was his own, but they had everything in common. With great power the apostles bore witness to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and great favor was accorded them all. There was no needy person among them, for those who owned property or houses would sell them, bring the proceeds of the sale, and put them at the feet of the apostles, and they were distributed to each according to need. Thus Joseph, also named by the apostles Barnabas (which is translated "son of encouragement"), a Levite, a Cypriot by birth, sold a piece of property that he owned, then brought the money and put it at the feet of the apostles.

ATTACKS ON GOD

Pakistani Christians jailed for blasphemous text messages A week after a Pakistani Christian was sentenced to life in prison for sending a blasphemous text message, a Christian couple was jailed for sending blasphemous text messages to a Muslim. Shafqat Masih, a handicapped man, confessed to the crime before a magistrate but later maintained that he was forced to do so by police. His wife, Shagufta, was also jailed. They have denied sending the text messages. The incident took place in Gojra, a city of 120,000 in eastern Pakistan that was the site of anti-Christian violence in 2009.
