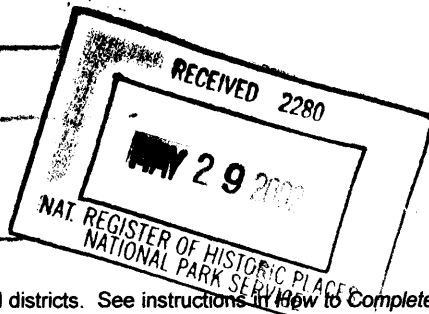

NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION

The Casa Grande Dispatch Building is located in central part of downtown Casa Grande. Within the original town site from 1879, the building is on one of the Casa Grande's oldest streets and today, which remains one of busier streets in the downtown district. The building is one designed for professional use as a newspaper office and printing plant. The building housed Casa Grande's only newspaper *The Casa Grande Dispatch* until at least 1951, and is executed in the Commercial style with some Mission Revival references and is of brick construction with storefront on the front façade. The original building appears to be sited on a 50 x 100 lot with no setbacks, giving the building roughly these same dimensions. An addition sometime after 1940 doubles the size of the building as it wraps the original with a narrow addition to the side and a deep addition in concrete block to the rear. The significant features of the original building are the large brick arch on the front facade, exposed brick pilasters, and brick coping on a Mission-style parapet treatment. The current condition of the property is very good, as it is both occupied and well maintained; it also has historic integrity in terms of location, design, setting and materials. A new decorative application of stucco not completely in character with the original character of the building has been applied to part of the front façade. Despite this, the association and feeling of the original building remains. The character is conveyed through the main street setting, the proportions, and the integral decorative elements that remain relatively intact such as the brickwork arch, the decorative brickwork on the façade, and the large storefront area.

This commercial building is a simple rectangle in plan and one story in height. The original building itself is one bay, with another bay created by the addition to the side. The building is constructed of brick in Commercial style. The roof is flat with parapets, with a pediment-shaped parapet. Load-bearing brick walls support a wood joist roof structure. Specific features of the building include an arched brick opening with a display window. Aluminum muntins have been added where the original storefront entry was removed; the entry is a single wood door that is no longer located directly on the front façade, but was moved onto the side façade to face onto a small covered porch created with the later addition. Important decorative elements are the pediment-shaped parapet with ornamental brick coping, the brick arched opening on the facade, the corner brick pilasters, and large display window area. The building has a sizable L-shaped addition that wraps the original to the side and rear. Built sometime after 1940, the addition utilizes concrete block with a stucco finish to emphasize the Mission/Spanish Colonial Revival imagery inherent in the arch on the façade of the original building. Mission/ Spanish Colonial Revival imagery is also evoked in the stepped parapet of the flat roofed addition, as well as the way the massing of the addition breaks the regular massing of the original building. A red, clay-tile shed roofed porch is another element that is utilized in the addition to conjure up the Mission/ Spanish Colonial Revival imagery popular during the era of the addition. The building itself constitutes the only contributing element to the nomination; there are no outbuildings associated with this property and thus, no noncontributing elements.

NARRATIVE STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

SUMMARY

The Casa Grande Dispatch building is eligible under Criterion A as an intact example of the Central Business District Commercial Building property type, related to the context of Planning and Development of Casa Grande, 1879-1951. It is also eligible under Criterion C as an intact example of the Commercial Style related to the context of Architecture in Casa Grande, 1900-1950. The period of the building's significance begins with its date of construction in 1929, and ends with the date of 1951, which coincides with the fifty-year cutoff date for eligibility. Its construction date coincides with the period during which trucks were replacing the railroad as the principal means of moving goods into and out of Casa Grande. Casa Grande continued in growth during this pre-Depression era, as evidenced by commercial buildings such as this. The building is typical of the Commercial style, with added stylistic details borrowed from Hispanic precedents. The property also has good integrity, as it has only minor alterations to the façade that do not detract from the historic character. It is in its original location. The primary façade has had the storefront replaced with a compatibly-designed modern storefront, and a Spanish-character addition to the side is well-differentiated from the original building; the original building, thus, still conveys its integrity of design. The building possesses the characteristics of the Central Business District Commercial Building property type, with the façade resting on the front property line in a streetscape of similarly sited buildings. There are five buildings of brick construction of the Central Business District Commercial Building property type in the area considered by the Historic Resource Survey- Casa Grande, Arizona (Pry 1998); this is one of them. There are only thirteen buildings of brick construction included within the Casa Grande survey area. The utilitarian appearance of the building is typical of the property type. The building was used for the delivery of goods and services to local residents, and contributes to the general understanding of development patterns in downtown Casa Grande in the early part of the 20th Century.

HISTORICAL OVERVIEW

This building, which has been enlarged over the years, was built by the Casa Grande Dispatch as its office and printing plant in 1929. It was in use by the Dispatch at least as late as 1981.
