

A big thank you to everyone who has responded, through prayer and giving, to April's appeal letter!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

On behalf of the whole Community, thank you to everyone who responded, with prayer and gifts, to the April Appeal.

By the end of November we had received one-off gifts of £43,000, including a very generous legacy and additional regular giving totalling £5,000 for the year. With Gift Aid recovered this means we are only £1,700 short of reaching our expected expenditure for 2009.

We are all very thankful to God for this response, and the leadership of the Community are now prayerfully considering the way forward into 2010. As we outlined in the April Appeal Letter, so much has been achieved for the Kingdom through the Maranatha Community, at a fraction of the cost that people might expect. However, we need to discern the way forward as our expected regular expenditure for 2010 currently exceeds our expected regular income by almost £1000 per week.

We have no doubt about the key vision that God has given the Community to promote Unity, Healing and Renewal in the body of Christ, and to share in a prophetic witness to the nation. In the present national situation, we believe God is giving Maranatha a particular role to play - indeed, we may have been brought into being 'for such a time as this'.

But we still need significant additional funds to fulfil this mandate, particularly through regular giving which helps us plan so much more effectively.

So, once again, many, many thanks to everyone who responded to the appeal. Please do keep praying for clear discernment of our Father's will.

If you are thinking of sending a gift but haven't yet had occasion to do so, please do prayerfully consider the Community's present position and think about what you could do to help.

We received some feedback from members saying they would like easier ways to support the Community financially, and we have responded to this request - please see overleaf for the different options which are available.

1. Set-up a Regular Gift
