UNWANTED CASH FOUND IN THE OFFERING

This is a very easy method of giving — it only relates to tax that you've already paid — and just requires the donor to complete a simple Declaration Form giving their name, address and confirmation that they pay tax. NEWS FROM HEIDI & CHRISTIAN

This summer we did our first mission trip as a couple. It was organised by a short term mission organisation called

Soapbox (<u>www.soapboxtrust.com</u>). Soapbox organise short Christian mission trips to many countries across the world. From Brazil to South Africa and from Kenya to the Philippines, Soapbox span the globe sending teams of volunteers of all ages to help communities in different ways. The work they do is incredible and we highly recommend

you do a Soapbox trip at some point in your life!

Our story starts months before we arrived at our mission project; having being set a target of fund raising just under £3,000 we started to create a plan. Using the multitude of technology available to us now we were able to create a fund raising website where people could sponsor us directly and set up a group on Facebook for people to join (yes, it has it's uses!). The hardest thing was thinking of something to do that was unusual and a challenge.

We decided to do a 10 km run and to complete the three peaks challenge. This involves climbing the tallest mountain in Scotland (Ben Nevis), the highest mountain in England (Scarfel Pike) and the tallest mountain in Wales (Snowdon) all in 24 hours with little or no sleep and with minimal food. We also roped in the help of friends and family and did a mass car wash at church and a penny run raising £500 through this alone. In the end with much prayer and support from a range of people close and distant to us we managed to achieve the target and we were off! Our two week mission trip took us to a home for newborn and abandoned babies called TLC (The Love of Christ Ministries) run by Thea Jarvis and her family. It is in Eikenhof which is about 10km south of Johannesburg (South Africa). Babies with different stories all arrive at the orphanage and are very well looked after. Each individual story is heart breaking ranging from being aids orphans, having HIV themselves, being dumped in toilets, drains and one very special child is a survivor of a late pregnancy abortion. These babies are then adopted by people from South Africa and abroad. They go to families who bring them up in a loving environment. The unfortunate few who do not go to families are then adopted into the Jarvis family and brought up as their own. It is because of TLC that these little babies get a second chance in life.

TLC has its own plot of land covering 23 acres referred to as The farm. They care for between 50 and 60 babies and toddlers. It's called a farm because they also have dogs, cats, a horse, a pony, pigs, geese, ducks, sheep, a tortoise and chickens (mostly all abandoned too)!

The orphanage is run by Thea Jarvis and her entire family. She has five biological children and fourteen more who are adopted! Her two eldest daughters Pippa and Joanna also have adopted over ten children.

TLC relies heavily on private funding from generous individuals. The

orphanage costs hundreds of thousands of pounds to run a year, from baby food and nappies to medicine and clothes, the costs are massive. This special place would soon cease to function if it wasn't for the kind donations that come from all over the world.

Another vital organ to TLC is the team of volunteers recruited from across the world and throughout the year to help run the orphanage. Most volunteers live on site in the cottages built specifically for them, they spend their day caring and loving the babies and children.

The majority of babies that come to TLC are ones who have been abandoned. We heard some horrific stories of babies found in toilets, in gutters and on the street. They come from mothers who for different reasons feel they can't look after them, perhaps they are too ill or they could even be an unwanted product of prostitution. Here in the Western World, we can't begin to imagine or understand some of the social problems which occur in Africa.

Even with such sad stories, TLC shines as a beacon of light and love. The babies and children are so happy and smiling because they are so well cared for and loved. Our small Soapbox team mostly worked with the group of children aged 3 to 5 known as The Tigers. We would run their morning pre-school lessons, play with them and generally look after them through the day.

We also cared for The Grubs, who were the 3-12 month old group of babies. They have a strict routine of eat, sleep and play, which we helped with.

TLC is one of the most special places in the world. We loved every minute of it! Coming back home was difficult. Not only was it a culture shock but we bonded so closely with the children that we missed them desperately.

Please pray for the continued work that TLC does, praying specifically for funding and an influx of keen volunteers helping to keep the orphanage running. Also please pray for Thea and her eldest daughter who continue to work exhausting hours to keep their family home running, pray for time to rest and recover.

We have enjoyed the trip so much that we are now going back for a longer period of 3 months! We definitely would recom-mend for anybody to do a Soapbox trip whether you are young, old, a student or in full time work. You

definitely won't regret it!
