





### Timeline: You Can Limit Who Sees Current or Past Posts




### **Control Privacy For Each Status Update**






### Increase Account Security: Notifications



## **Working with Survivors**

Whether abusers are impersonating, taking over sites, harassing, or monitoring – help survivors know their options.

#### Recourses may include:

- Reporting inappropriate or false content or pages to site owner may result in removal of content or page if it violates terms of use.
- Most sites have a process for users if their account has been compromised.
- Misuse may be a violation of an order or part of a stalking or harassment charge.

## Safety Planning with Survivors

#### Giving up social networks is not the only option.

It may be a helpful support system.

#### Consider benefits and risks of:

- Changing account settings for privacy, security, blocking.
- Temporarily decreasing, changing or stopping postings.
- Thinking carefully about what get posted by you & others. Who might eventually see or share it?
- Creating a new "identity" with a private smaller set of "friends" who will commit to protect your privacy.
- Creating the new identity on a different social network.

# Safety Planning with Survivors Questions to Consider

- Who might respect your heightened need for online privacy & safety? Which "friends" (family, friends, acquaintances)?
- What changes might you & those "friends" need to make to social networking settings?
- What kinds of conversations might you want to have with advocates and select "friends" to help you decide?
- What are the privacy / content policies of the site you are using or want to use? When might reporting violations to the site and police be a helpful safety strategy?







# Canadian Personal Property Records: search by owner, address, area.

Personal Property Registries. All Canadian jurisdictions provide public access to the Personal Property Security Registry (PPSA). The databases generally provide records for security interests (e.g. loans, leases, liens) registered against property (e.g. a car or boat). PPSA databases can be good sources to find full names, addresses, and birth dates for individuals. You may also make use of land title records. You can look up property ownership with the name of an individual or company and find the address of properties they own which may be useful if you can't establish an address through other means. These provincial registries are listed in the <u>Financial Background</u> section of this toolkit.


Abusers continue to find and adapt computer programs (software) and hardware tools to further stalk and harass their victims. They not only use simple technology monitoring options like viewing web browser histories or intercepting email, but they also use more sophisticated computer Spyware programs and monitoring devices.


### **Computer Spyware**



Unauthorized person secretely monitors all activities.
 Hard to detect or remove, some secretly reinstall.








### Instant Message (IM) & Email Risks











### **Safety & Confidentiality**

- Safety Plan around ways an abuser might be monitoring a computer, or, be trying to install Spyware.
- Strategize if Spyware or Monitoring is detected involve police, don't want to alert abuser.
- Use a "safer" computer (e.g. public library) to do things you don't want abuser to know.
- Create new accounts on a safer computer.
- Try to keep personal or identifying information offline.

### If Using Online Forms or Services, Alert About Computer Safety

#### Safety Check

Before you ask your question, please read the following list to help you determine if your computer use is safe:

- Ooes someone else have access to this computer?
- Is it possible that someone has installed spyware to monitor this computer?
- Oid someone give you this computer?
- Ooes someone else often seem to know what websites you have visited on this computer?

If you answered YES to any of these questions, you may not want to use this service right now. If your computer is not safe, you can go to a community center, library or a trusted friend's house instead. If your email is not safe, you can create a new email from a safe computer using a free email program like Gmail or Hotmail.

### **Data Privacy & Safety**

- zip code, sex, date of birth are all that's needed to deanonymize someone in the US
- Computers with client data on them should be kept separate from any other networks.
   (e.g. survivor wireless networks in a shelter)
- Firewalls are just locks on a door, they stop honest people from going further. They can be breached.

### What Types of Data Gets Shared or Kept?

- Annonymous versus Pseudonymous
- Personally Identifiable Information
- Client Level versus Aggregate
- How re-identifiable is the data?
- Where you put client data emails? Database, paper file

#### Minimize Data Collected & Accessed

- Who needs to access the case file?
- Can survivors review their own case files?
- Are some client files linked? For example, a mother's file and her 2 children's files?
- What is the client's "file" if a court order gets served? Where are the client's files?
- How are your files encrypted?

### Case Files & Management Systems


How do case files get shared or transmitted between staff: onsite, offsite, satalite offices, staff colocated at other organizations, etc.
