## GROWING IN GOD

With the season of Lent right around the corner, it is appropriate to reflect on what areas of our life God invites us deeper toward conversion. When I was growing up, I would pretty much just pick an area

of my life I thought needed change or would be a challenge for me. Lent is a penitential season, and since most of us know ourselves the best this is not a bad process. However, I invite you to take the question of what disciplines you will attempt, to the Lord. Ask God what area of your life is most in need of change and challenge. We may know ourselves, but God knew us even before we were born.

Perhaps one of the most profound invitations of our faith is to offer and experience forgiveness. The simple, but life changing words of the prayer Jesus taught us: "Forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us," is often one of the most difficult experiences to act on in our humanity.

This year, I invite us as parish communities to read and reflect upon the book entitled, Everybody Needs to Forgive Somebody, by Dr. Allen R. Hunt. The book is neither a novel nor an educational text. It is a collection of 11 stories of forgiveness. I encourage this to be a family study. Perhaps each week, you read the story together, or independently, and then discuss it as a group. It is not a time for identifying how many times a person has fallen. But, an effort to listen to one another. You may also wish to form a small group of your parish friends and do the same.

May God assist us in identifying areas of needed conversion in our lives and the courage to walk forward in our efforts to change.

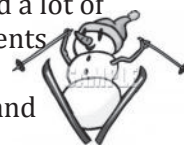

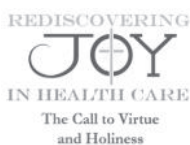

## Prayer Chain Requests

**Baptism Class :** Baptism class is required before a first Baptism. Baptism classes are held in the months of January, April, July and October. Parents are encouraged to attend a Baptism class before the birth of their first child. Contact the church office at 634-3813. Preregistration is required.



**The Wedding Policy of the Diocese of St. Cloud** requires that you contact the parish at least 6 months prior to your wedding. This is necessary so that all the required steps can be completed in a timely manner. For second marriages, more time may be required. To begin your marriage preparation or for questions about the marriage preparation policy, contact Father Michael at the parish office (634-3813).
